REVOLT PROTESTS RULE BY JAPANESE

TOKYO, Sept. 28.—(AP)—A serious revolt against the Japanese-supported state of Manchukuo has broken out in western Heilungkiang Province northwest of Tsitsihai, scene of one of the strongest stands made by the Chinese during Japan's military campaign a year ago.

The Reiko (Japanese) news agency at Harbin received dispatches confirming reports that insurgents had occupied the city of Manchuli on the Manchurian-Siberian frontier, as well as the towns of Haila, Puhau and Delmou. These insurgents, the dispatches said, hauled down the flag of the new state of Manchukuo and raised in its place the national banner of China.

Heavy fighting preceded the occupation of Manchuli. The insurgents destroyed the barracks of the Manchukuo troops there with their artillery fire.

Communication with the western part of the province appeared to have broken down after the Japanese consul telegraphed Tsitsihai for help. Bands of Chinese railway guards arose in revolt, the consul reported, and a Japanese airplane dispatched on a scouting expedition west of Tsitsihai failed to return.
