

COUNTY C. E. TO MEET HERE

Convention Program Ready;
Opens at Presbyterian
Church Oct. 7

Program for Marion county's Christian Endeavor convention has been completed, and the clerics of the First Presbyterian church of Salem as hosts of the convention await the night of October 7 for the opening session. The convention proper will conclude Saturday night, this year, with only a retreat for the new union officers with members of the state union on Sunday afternoon scheduled for that day.

Pre-registration compares favorably with that of last year, when it exceeded that of all former conventions.

The complete program follows: Friday night: registration, followed by song service and prayer at 7:30; announcements; talk, international convention; special music; address, "C. E. and your church", Rev. Hugh N. McCallum; concluding with social period, by Elva Ault.

Saturday morning: Quiet hour, Glen Hinard; announcements; society reports and analysis report; conferences; recruiting new workers, Helen McClay, Portland, and financing His work, Viola Ogden, Portland; assembly: Bible study, "The greatest partnership in the world", Dr. Grover C. Birchett, of the convention church. The morning's session begins at 9 o'clock.

Saturday afternoon: Beginning at 2 o'clock, song service and prayer; talk, How C. E. helps me, Milo Ross; Keeping account of what you have done, Viola Ogden; Acting my part, Rev. W. O. Livingston, Silvertown; discussion led by Rev. C. C. Haworth; special music; election of officers; The Christian Endeavor World, David Moser; closing at 4 o'clock.

Saturday night: banquet at 6 o'clock; song service and prayer at 7:30; state convention, Eugene, 1933; Using our money in His work, James C. Henderson, Portland; address, The Spirit of Joy, Dr. Emory W. Beardsley; special music; installation of officers; awards; covenant service; and closing of convention.

Miss Lois Plummer is pianist, and John Schmidt, Jr., will lead the singing. The county president, Ella Smith, will preside over all sessions.

No Assessment is Reported by Hop Men's Fire Relief

AURORA, Oct. 1. — No assessment will be levied by the Hop Growers' Fire Relief association despite published reports to the contrary. At a recent meeting of directors here gross assets of the association were shown to be \$53,358. Despite losses sustained by defalcation, the association thinks its reserves adequate.

Only one loss has been sustained by the association this year and the hop drying season is nearly over. The association has existed 26 continuous years without an assessment.

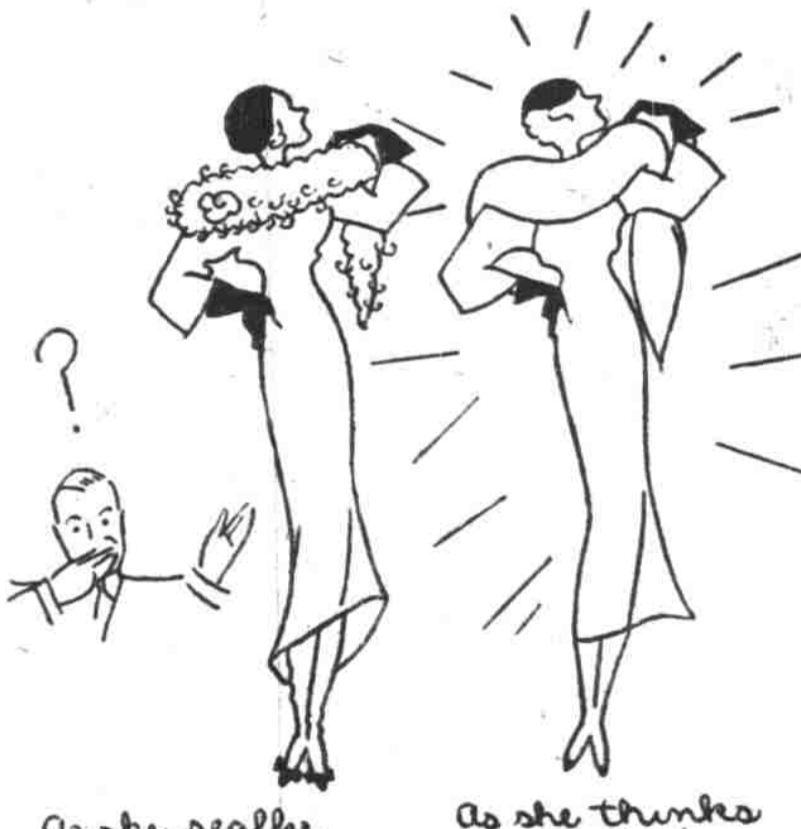
