which this week has been celebrating its 80th anniversary. Rev. Dickinson donated the site for the church building, and was the first pastor of the church. He was afterward the pioneer Oregon seedman, conducting the business affairs of his extensive operations in that line in his own building, northwest corner of Commercial and Chemeketa streets.

That property was bought by the State Insurance company, and that building was enlarged and is yet a part of it; the two story part on the corner named. After the insurance company went out of business the property was bought by the Salem Y. M. C. A., and was occupied by that institution until it moved into its present home. There, and next door north, is where Herbert Hoover as a boy worked as clerk for the Oregon Land company, up to the time of leaving for Stanford university in the fall of 1895; a stepping stone in his life that led to his election to the office of president of the United States. Mr. Raymond was long employed by O. Dickinson in his seed business. Gildoor Stola started his career in Oregon as an employee of O. Dickinson, in his seed gardens fronting on the Garden road; on land that is now the site of a growing suburb of the city, and will be long be taken into the corporate limits.

Lawrence Lockley as a boy attended grade school in Salem and high school in Portland, graduating from the Washington high school in that city. Frederic Lockley, his grandfather, was a scholarly man, an editor of newspapers and a writer of ability. He was a resident of Salem for a number of years.

Fred Lockley, father of Lawrence, had little formal education. He picked up what he knows from reading and interviewing people—and the work he has done in newspaper and magazine editing and publishing, and in writing his lengthening list of books, shows that he is one of the best informed and most widely known men in all the territory that comprised the old Oregon country, and one

### BLAZES INAUGURATE FIRE PREVENTION WEEK



National fire prevention week had no sooner dawned than two of Montana's largest business block fires got underway. This photo shows the Hammond Block in Missoula, being gutted by flames. Seven business establishments were destroyed and 40 occupants of apartments were driven to the street in smoky attire. At the same time a similar fire occurred in Butte, raising a building which contained four business houses and two hotels. Thirty-five persons were forced to flee to the ice-covered streets. Total damage of approximately \$500,000 resulted from the two fires.
