Two Men Held in South Wanted as Fugitives, Word

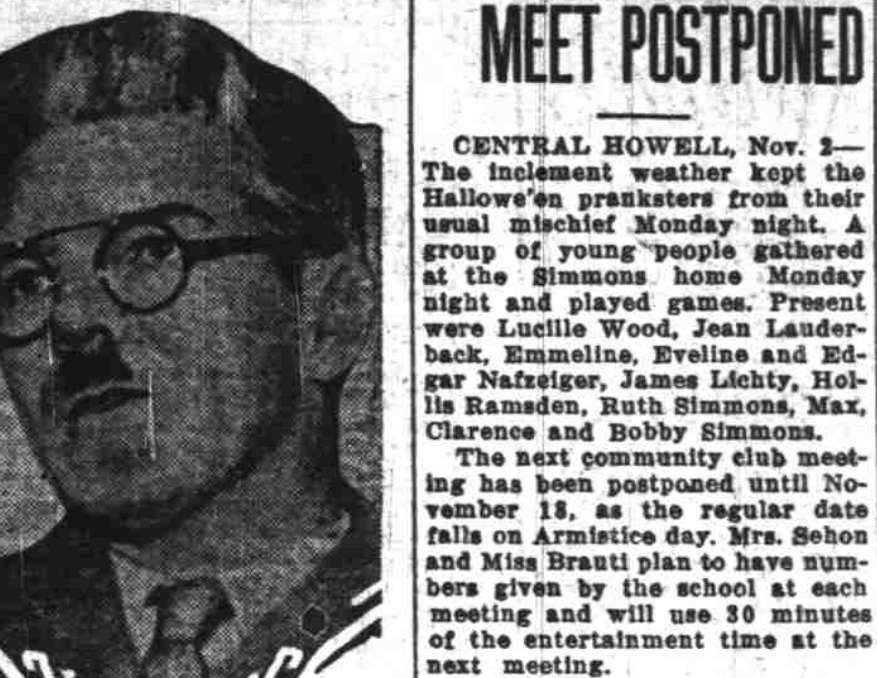
