## Weakness in Storage Eggs Gains but Facts Hidden

PORTLAND, Nov. 5.—(AP)—Despite the fact that egg prices are showing little, if any, material change in leading centers throughout the country, there was a certain easiness in the trend that could be overlooked. Not only does the trade feel that the seasonable period for easier prices was at hand but there appears little doubt but that late advances in fresh goods have been more or less forced by a desperate attempt of those holding storage goods to clean up.

The weakness and dullness in storage eggs was gaining rapidly although the late strength in fresh goods has been used as a screen to hide the facts. By advancing fresh goods, holders of storage eggs have been enabled to hold a sliding demand for ice house goods in check.

There was no change in the price of butter for the week end. This applied to the open market for cuben and prints and to the exchange on the former. Butterfat, however, is firmer and is touching 21 in spots.

For the week end there was no change in the general chicken market situation. Demand appears favorable at current values for all sorts of hens but springer stuff remains more or less drab.

## Sunnyside's Prune Harvest Estimated At About 215 Tons

SUNNYSIDE, Nov. 5.—The prune harvest is over showing a very light crop for this district of a large acreage. The total amount of dried prunes put out by all driers this season was approximately 215 tons, several driers not running at all. Fall drying done, applies a light crop, picking still going on.

Business is languishing, with hens on a strike, old hens sold off for pullets. A good tonnage of walnuts was harvested and of good quality.
