In the notice of suspension, Father Phelan gave "interference with the proper working of our athletic department by an unauthorized though widely published attempt to discharge one of our staff" as the cause of McEwan's being suspended.

The "published attempt to discharge one of our staff" related to Captain McEwan's argument with Bart Sullivan, trainer, during the game, which Holy Cross lost to 7, and Captain McEwan was quoted as saying Sullivan had openly mutinied, and could no longer act as trainer for the football squad.
