HOLMAN TO STUDY INSTITUTION NEEDS

Inspection of the various state institutions to determine definitely what improvements, if any, will be required early in the next biennium, has been undertaken by Rufus C. Holman, state treasurer and member of the Oregon state board of control.

Holman declared that while he would not recommend the expenditure of any large amount of money he probably would suggest a number of minor improvements which would prove beneficial both to the institution officials and the inmates.

At the state penitentiary Holman will ask that the stoves now used in the watch towers be supplemented with some other kind of heating device. He said the towers were cold and uncomfortable during the winter months and were a menace to the health of the guards.

The state treasurer said he would complete his investigation within the next 10 days, when he would prepare a formal report.
