Transfer of the stock was made during 1930 and 1931 for preferred stock of the Northwest Public Service corporation which had traded its stock for original preferred stock issued by the Portland General Electric company. During the past summer a number of stockholders filed suit here to recover the par value of their stock on the grounds the transfers had been made under minrepresentation by salesmen. None of the cases have as yet come to trial.
