12,000,000 POUNDS OF PRUNES SHIPPED

In October-November, Most Are 1931 Crop; Foreign Export is Largest

A few new-crop dried prunes were shipped in September, but probably 95 per cent of Portland's 2,700,000 pounds shipped by boat in that month represented clean-up of 1931 crop holdings.

The effort, October-November boat loadings, totaling 12 million pounds, quite closely measured the boat movement of 1932 crop prunes through this port.

50 BUTTER ADVANCE ECHOED WEDNESDAY

PORTLAND, Dec. 14.—(AP)—A 50-cent advance in the butter price in the local butter trade appears underlying the advance in the situation which would otherwise call for increasing strength.

The trade appears afraid to advance prices in spite of the previous blowup of artificial values.

The local make is holding up quite well but some decrease is noted in late arrivals from outside points.

There was no change in prices for the day in the butter trade but butterfat continues firm with more paying the higher figures.

There is a temporary shortage of eggs here on account of weather conditions according to trade leaders and stiffening of quotations is expected and in spots high figures are named.

There is a shortage of live chickens showing as a result of low prices and weather conditions. However, demand is not any too brisk because of the lowness of prices for other fowls and especially turkeys.

Attempt to bolster up country killed lamb prices appears to have resulted only in creating weakness in the trade with a slow movement into consuming channels. Veal and hogs are steady.

GRAINS, STOCKS BOTH ADVANCED DESPITE DEFAULTS IN WAR DEBTS

Government Report on Grains Awaited; Wheat 3/8 up

CHICAGO, Dec. 14.—(AP)—Unstirred by refusal of France to pay on her war debts, grain markets today turned placidly to other price-making factors, and scored an advance.

At no time did Chicago wheat values show a decline of more than a fraction of a cent a bushel. Late strength of the New York stock market was credited with helping wheat upward late.

With most operators here awaiting the Washington government final report tomorrow on 1932 domestic crops, and with trade lacking volume, wheat closed firm at the day's top level, unchanged to 3/8, oats up 1/8.

Today's closing quotations: Wheat—December, 44 1/2; May, 47 3/4; July, 47 3/4-48. Corn—December, 22 1/2; May, 27 3/4; July, 28 3/4-29. Oats—December, 15 1/2; May, 17 1/2; July, 17 1/2-18.
