WINNIPEG DEPRESSES U. S. GRAINS LOCAL EGG PRICES DROP ONE CENT

Notable Setback is Result of Stop Loss Report

CHICAGO, Jan. 9.—(AP)—Disquieted by reports of stop loss selling at Winnipeg and by apparent exhaustion of aggressive buying in Chicago, grain markets underwent a notable setback today. Downturns came after wheat here and at Liverpool had mounted to the highest levels in nearly two months, with the Chicago market showing a 1-1/4 cent advance almost vertical climb of late. Much of today's selling of wheat was associated with the belief expressed by trade experts that reactions were to be looked for after such a steep movement aloft.

Wheat closed unsteady, 5-8 to 1 under Saturday's finish, corn 1/4 to 2-4 days, oats 1-3 to 1-4 off.

Other Commodities in Salem Stable at Old Prices

Eggs fell a cent in the local market yesterday, bringing the wholesale price for extras down to 20c. The past week brought a rise in wheat and grain prices here and throughout the northwest, due largely to tight marketing and continued unfavorable prospects for winter wheat and higher foreign markets.

Fruits, vegetables, dairy products and meats remained stationary. A January 3 report of the bureau of agricultural economics places the farm price index below the depression low price registered last June. The index lost 2 points from November 15 to December 15 with declines in all farm products except potatoes, apples, lambs, eggs, butter and oil.
