EGG MART IS WEAK, BUTTER ABOUT SAME

Cut of 1/2 c lb in the price on standard butter during the weak-end session of the produce exchange was not unexpected but appears out of line with actual sales on the open market. Standard prices were practically all right but the extras do not sell usually more than 1/4 c above them.

The lack of snap in the sessions of the produce exchange was again generally noted with prices dominated by fractions. Open market prices appear steady all around with the best call for standard grade.

Butterfat values were steady. Market tone for eggs continues to reflect nothing but weakness. No open price changes were shown but sales generally continue below full values. Prices were somewhat above the sales a year ago.

STOCKS DRIFT DOWNWARD AGAIN LEGISLATION UNSETTLES WHEAT

Oats Unchanged, Corn 3/8-5/8 Off; Wheat is Down 1/4-1/2

CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—(AP)—Unsettled by predictions of moisture in domestic winter wheat areas southwest and by uncertainty of legislative developments at Washington, grain prices headed downward today.

Wheat price setbacks were in the face of railroad reports indicating likelihood of the heaviest domestic winter crop abandonment in years. Enlarged export buying of Canadian wheat failed to act as a stimulus and was attributed to lameness of Canadian funds.

Wheat closed yesterday, 1/4-1/2 down yesterday's finish, corn 3/8-5/8 off, oats unchanged. Today's closing quotations: Wheat—May, 47 3/4 c; July, 47 1/4 c; September, 48 3/4 c. Corn—May, 26 3/4 c; July, 27 c; September, 28 1/2 c. Oats—May, 17 1/4 c; July, 17 c.
