

LUDANEY IS GIVEN SEVEN YEAR TERM

Frank Ludaney, found guilty of attempted assault on Theresa Zech of Mt. Angel, was yesterday sentenced to seven years in the state penitentiary by Judge L. H. McMahan. No parole was granted.

Ludaney persisted that he did not do that for which a jury convicted him Thursday night after 10 hours of deliberation, and as sentence was imposed was apparently on the verge of breaking down. He was braced by his attorney, and almost immediately regained his composure.

District Attorney Trindle, who with Deputy Lyle Page prosecuted the case, agreed that Ludaney's attorney might have 30 days to file motion for a new trial. However, it is regarded there is

little likelihood of this. Ludaney's brother was at the courtroom door as Ludaney went out with Deputy Sheriff Bert Smith, and as the convicted man passed the brother broke into sobs. Ludaney's wife, who was with him all the time during the trial, was not in the courtroom.
