## LARGE CROWD HANDED TREAT

Salem Grappiers Nose out Ahead, Portland Glove Tossers Prevail

The Salem Y. M. C. A. nosed out a victory in wrestling, 24 points to 22, over Multnomah club of Portland, and the clubmen defeated the Y. in boxing bouts, theree to two, at the Y. gymnasium Wednesday night. A large crowd was present and received its money's worth, as both wrestlers and boxers went after each other with everything they had.

Salem's three lighter wrestlers made a clean sweep of their bouts, all taking falls, and then Multnomah came back to win the last three, but took one by a de-






