# PROPER SAMPLES OF SOIL FOR TEST TOLD

Soil samples improperly taken make it impossible for the soils department of Oregon State college to supply useful data on the lime and fertilizer requirements of soils sent in by farmers, say members of the department. "The proper way to take a soil sample is to take a representative part of the field and included a separate sample of one pint from each layer to a depth of three feet or to raw material, beginning with a slice taken to plow depth, the legal location, past treatment, drainage condition, and the desired use being given when possible," says Dr. W. I. Powers, professor of soils. Fertilizer requirements are indicated by simplified tests which can be made in a few minutes. The soil has to be air dried before
