**181 Men to Work**—The U. S. Y. M. C. A. Employment bureau yesterday reported 181 men and two women to work during the week past. Of these, 100 men were placed on the county's grubbing lot at Hopmore and 66 on road work, which was begun Wednesday. Other jobs provided were: Common labor 12, farms one, woodcutting two and housework two. Except for the additional relief work, the employment situation was unchanged.

## QUAKES CAUGHT IN SCIENTISTS 'TRAPS'

WASHINGTON, March 11—(AP)—Uncle Sam's scientists set a trap for an earthquake a few months ago and now a quake has come along and jumped right into it.

The trap—really a series of 12 traps—consists of machines designed to record just how the ground shakes and shivers when an earthquake occurs. A knowledge of this is necessary for scientific construction of buildings designed to resist the "snap-the-whip" effect of earthquake shocks.

Today scientists of the United States coast and geodetic survey on the west coast were on the way to inspect the traps, to see just how much earthquake knowledge had been caught.

Four traps were in the earthquake zone, two at Los Angeles, and one each at Long Beach and San Diego. Just how the traps had worked was not immediately known, due to difficulty of reaching points where they were installed.

## OVER 135 FARMERS APPLY FOR LOANS

Between 135 and 150 farmers had filed federal seed loan applications with the Salem committee at closing time last night, P. H. Bell, advisor to the committee, announced. An accurate count was not possible, he said. If a new supply of blanks arrives, steady taking of applications will be resumed in the chamber of commerce auditorium tomorrow.

Swamped with the work of checking on the application papers, the approval committee yesterday had approved 21 applications and rejected but one. It is expected the committee will catch up in its work this weekend.
