LOWER MOHAIR CLIP PRODUCED IN 1932

Oregon Clip Remains Same, With Average per Goat Down Slightly

Mohair production in 1932, including kid hair, in six leading mohair states was 16,495,000 pounds, compared to 19,071,000 pounds clipped in 1931, according to the estimate of the United States department of agriculture. This decline was due to a decrease of 7 per cent in the number of goats clipped and in the average clip per goat.

Last year Oregon clipped 115,000 goats, the same as in 1931 and 5000 head less than in 1930. The total mohair received in 1932 was 460,000 pounds, which was 12,000 pounds less than in 1931, and 20,000 pounds under 1930.

The average clip per goat in Oregon last year was four pounds, the same as in 1930 and a tenth of a pound off 1931.

In other leading states, goats clipped in 1932 were: Texas, 342,000 head, New Mexico 250,000, Arizona 200,000, California 170,000 and Missouri 66,000. The mohair cut in these states last year was: Texas 14,000,000 pounds, New Mexico 1,000,000, Arizona 760,000, California 130,000, Missouri 145,000.

Missouri's clip last year averaged only 2 1/2 pounds per goat; Texas' ran highest, with 4 1/2 pounds. New Mexico reported the same as Oregon, and Arizona's and California's average clip was 3.8 and 3.5 pounds, respectively.

Lumber Industry Upswing is Seen

The Oregon lumber industry has already made one sizeable sale of goods as a direct result of return of beer, according to a Klamath Falls resident who visited in Salem yesterday.

He reports that the Weyerhaeuser Lumber company at Klamath Falls has sold 20 carloads of pine material for beer cases to the Owens Bottle company of Alton, Ill.
