

## NAZARENES ELECT OFFICERS FOR YEAR

Annual Reports Show Healthy Gain in all Departments of Church

The annual meeting of the local Nazarene church Tuesday night showed a healthy gain in all departments. The average attendance in Sunday school had increased from 188 last year to 230 this year, including summer months and all. There was an increase of 33 in church membership. The financial reports showed \$500 paid out for home and foreign missions, \$791 paid for building indebtedness, \$125 met in full the building payments for the year, and \$3,000 for the local year, and \$2,000 for the Sunday school and the N. Y. P. S. departments.

Little, Sunday school superintendent, will also be members of the district assembly by virtue of their office. Dr. J. W. Goodwin of Pasadena, California, general superintendent of the denomination will preside over the meet at Portland.

The young people's rally held in the Nazarene church here Monday was not as large in attendance as had been anticipated because of the heavy Easter programs in the local churches, but 10 churches were represented and 250 young people were present. Rev. Donnell J. Smith, pastor of the First Church of the Nazarene of Portland, was the speaker. He was for 10 years the general N. Y. P. S. president.

## STATE ENDEAVORERS TO GATHER, EUGENE

The 43rd state convention of the Oregon Christian Endeavor Union will open Thursday night, April 27 and close Sunday night, April 30, at the First Christian church in Eugene.
