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THE ELMER GAME



BOSTON, IN THIS GAME THE PLAYERS—EXCEPT THEY—ARE SEATED, THE CHAIRS FACING IN AND ABOUT SIX FEET APART, THE IT IS BLINDFOLDED AND STATIONED BETWEEN THE TWO ROWS OF CHAIRS, EACH PLAYER IS GIVEN A NUMBER—IF NINE ARE PLAYING THE NUMBERS WOULD RUN FROM 1 TO 9—WHEN THE GAME BEGINS IT CALLS OUT TWO NUMBERS LIKE 3 AND 3, OR 5 AND 7, OR ANY OTHER TWO NUMBERS UNDER 9, THE PLAYERS HAVING THE NUMBERS CALLED MUST CHANGE SEATS AND IF IT CATCHES ONE, THAT PLAYER BECOMES IT WHEN THE PLAYERS SUCCEED, SEVERAL TIMES IN CHANGING SEATS WITHOUT BEING CAUGHT IT CALLS OUT, BOSTON! AND ALL PLAYERS MUST CHANGE SEATS, USUALLY IN THIS GRAND RUSH IT MANAGES TO FIND AN UNOCCUPIED CHAIR, THE PLAYER LEFT OUT THEN BECOMES IT.
