ANTI-REPEAL MASS MEETING IS SUNDAY

'Pussyfoot' Johnson, Thomas Gales to Speak at First Methodist Church

A mass meeting of Salem citi-zens will be held Sunday night at 7:30 o'clock in the first Methodist church auditorium when William E. "Pussyfoot" Johnson and Thomas W. Gales, former state superintendent of the Anti - Saloon league of North Dakota, will speak in opposition to repeal of the 18th amendment. The two men are on a statewide tour, working against Oregon's repeal in the July 21 vote on the 18th

Gales will speak first, his topic being "Bring Up the Reserves." He comes to Salem as a man who has devoted the greater part of his life to a fight against the liquor evil. At first a detective engaged in liquor law prosecutions in Montreal, Canada, he later became a minister and then an anti-saloon worker in Wisconsin and North Dakota.

"Pussyfoot" Johnson has for years been internationally prominent in campaigns against liquor. He started his work as a federal investigator under President Theodore Roosevelt in Oklahoma territory. Years later he lost an eye when a hoodlum threw a rock at him in the streets in London. Admirers in that city raised a fund to pay him for his injury and the king sent a message of sympathy. Johnson thanked the king, sent the money to a hospital for the blind and declared that his remaining eye could see the world go dry.
