Increasing prices for most all goods is already very noticeable in making state purchases, William Einzig, secretary of the state board of control, declared yesterday. Certain staples such as muslin, used in large quantities by the state hospitals, has increased 30 per cent in the last

Einzig said that the state had made heavy purchases early this spring, anticipating the rise and consequently its budget for sup plies will not be unbalanced for considerable period. By next lanuary, when the third quarter of the biennium begins, Einzig said increased prices may operate to throw the budget out of balance inasmuch as funds allotted for goods will be insufficient to provide goods at the higher

The 1933 legislature passed a drastically reduced budget for 1933-1934. At that time it was poited out that any major advances in commodity prices would upset the calculations.
