

33-YEAR OLD ARMY FOOD ORDER FOUND

Unearthed in Army Desk;
Hard Bread, Dried Fish,
Beans, Prunes Asked

A yellowed, typewritten order, tapped off by a United States army commissary officer, at Malabon, Manila province, P. I., 33 years ago, was recently unearthed in an old field desk used at the army here, Staff Sergeant William DePew of the medical detachment, 249 the Coast artillery, reported Thursday. Army transport stickers indicated the battered desk must have been brought to the United States from the islands, sent to France during the world war, then returned here.

Stuck in a remote corner of the desk, the order had apparently escaped notice these many years. The desk had been at the army here for five years. Sergeant DePew discovered the order while cleaning out the desk in preparation for putting it into use again.

Signing the order proper was Captain J. H. Duval, commissary department. A duplicate accompanying it was signed by Edward E. Dravo, Major, C. S. U. S. Army, stationer at Manila.

CORVALLIS ASKING HIGH SCHOOL LOAN

CORVALLIS, Ore., July 6.—(AP)—A grant and loan of \$300,000 for construction of a new high school here will be sought from the federal public works fund, the school board decided at a meeting today. A special election has been called for July 17 to pass on a bond issue to take care of 70 per cent of the cost which would be advanced by the government in the form of a long term loan at a low interest rate, should the application be approved.

The board purchased a site for the new building several years ago and planned to build in 1934, but abandoned plans because of the depression. Because of the offer of a 30 per cent donation from the government and also because of present low cost of construction, the board decided today it would be good business to proceed at once and ordered plans drawn up so that construction could be quickly started. Board members said the present building, used since 1909, has been far outgrown, and is needed for junior high school work.

BEST MILK ASSURED FOR SUMMER CAMPS

Boys and girls attending the Boy Scout and Girl Reserve summer camps on the Little North fork of the Santiam river this year will have milk equivalent to the city standard to drink, J. E. Blinkhorn, county dairy and food inspector, reported yesterday. Leaders of both camps have declared that the milk supply must be of the best quality, he said.

Consequently Blinkhorn will go to the Santiam region today to advise the farmers intending to

supply the milk of what they must do to comply with the standard maintained in Salem. The milk will be of Grade A Raw quality.

The water supply at the Girl Reserve camp, across from Taylor's grove has been found safe, according to the inspector, but changes are being required in that at the scout camp.

Disease Cases Few — But 11 new cases of communicable disease were reported in Marion county for the week ending July 3, the state department of health bulletin states. Of these, five were pneumonia and one each typhoid fever, measles, influenza, tuberculosis and pneumonia. Eighty-six per cent of the physicians in the county reported.
