

Liberty Club Scores Again In Home Plan

LIBERTY, July 6. — The Liberty Women's club Wednesday received word of having won third prize in the nation-wide "ideal rural home" contest, conducted by the women's department of the Country Gentleman magazine. A check for \$10 prize money was received. The September number of the magazine is to carry the announcements, plans, etc., of the prize winners.

In view of the national and even international recognition received through the project, this rural club feels proud of its achievement.

The ideal home project as submitted was the entire house building plan, dimensions, materials, furniture and its placing, and listing of every item in home furnishing.

The grounds were also plotted and all shrubs, trees and flowers were named and put into its own particular spot in the drawings. English type architecture in a two-story style was chosen. As no limit on proposed cost was made, the club decided it would be no "trick" at all to plan an ideal country home on such unlimited means. The upper story plan consisted of three bedrooms and bath; the first floor, kitchen, nook, office, dining and living rooms, one bedroom and bath; the full basement divided into storeroom, laundry, furnace and recreation room.
