

Secured and preferred liabilities paid in cash, \$48,056.14; unsecured liabilities offset, \$4407.23; unsecured liabilities for which receiver's certificates have been issued, 160,067.96; unpaid secured liabilities (both proved and unproved), \$40,-357.42; unsecured liabilities not paid or proved, \$6858. 53; total liabilities accounted for, \$259,-474.28.

Total collections accounted for, \$99,590.48. The statement also shows that the expenses of receivership including taxes, insurance and upkeep on the bank building has been \$8143.57.
