

Schapp's Shaken Up, Seeks Revenge on Senators Sunday

REPP TO BRING REVAMPED NINE

Promises his Charges Will Get More Than Three Hits This Time

Harold Repp, manager of Schapp's, has notified Manager Frank Bashor of the Senators that he is bringing almost a brand new team here Sunday with the avowed intention of gaining revenge for the 1 to 0 beating the Solons handed out two weeks ago. Heller, one of Schapp's two ace hurlers, held the Senators to five hits on that occasion and still lost the game, and it rankles.

He is not certain what players he will start against Schapp's but there is some possibility of one change in the infield and Doby Wood may be given an outfield berth because of his hitting ability. This would still leave him available for mound duty. Johnny Beck will also be on hand but in view of Wilson's previous mastery of the restaurant situation, the left hander is expected to get first call Sunday.

Carey Advises Union Savings Accept Offer

PORTLAND, Ore., July 20 (AP)—Charles H. Carey, state corporation commissioner, today addressed an open letter to the 4200 shareholders of the Union Savings & Loan association, now in his hands, recommending that the offer of O. B. Berrien and associates of Salt Lake City to purchase the assets of the association be accepted.

He said he recommended the Berrien offer as the most feasible plan devised to conserve the assets and one which would make moderate stock loans available for relief of shareholders.

Circuit Judge Tucker, to whom Commissioner Carey presented recommendations, and who heard objections on the part of two of the shareholders, held that the Berrien offer should be accepted by August 15 unless a more feasible plan should be offered before then.

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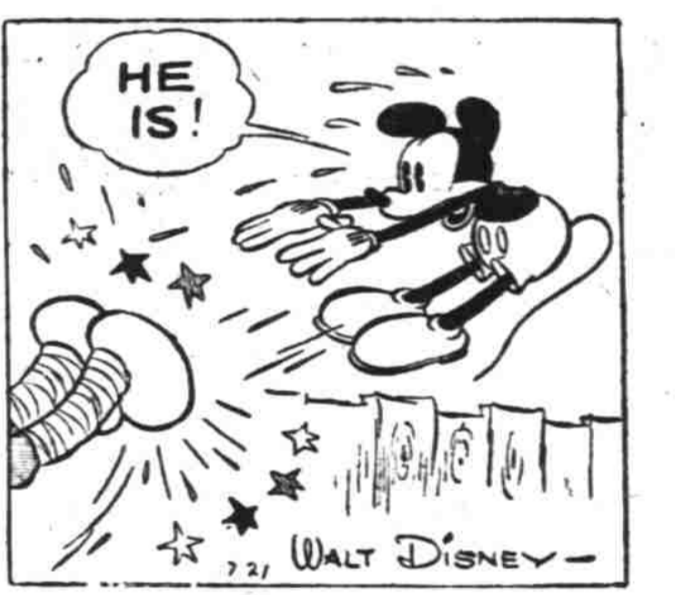
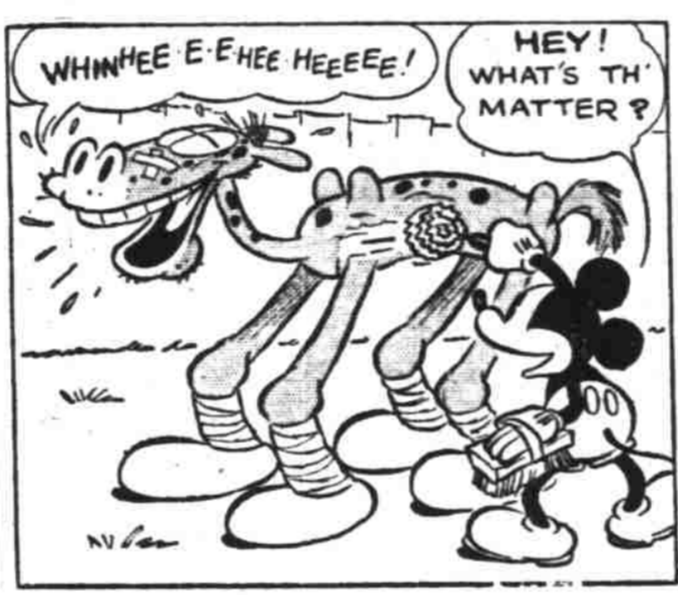
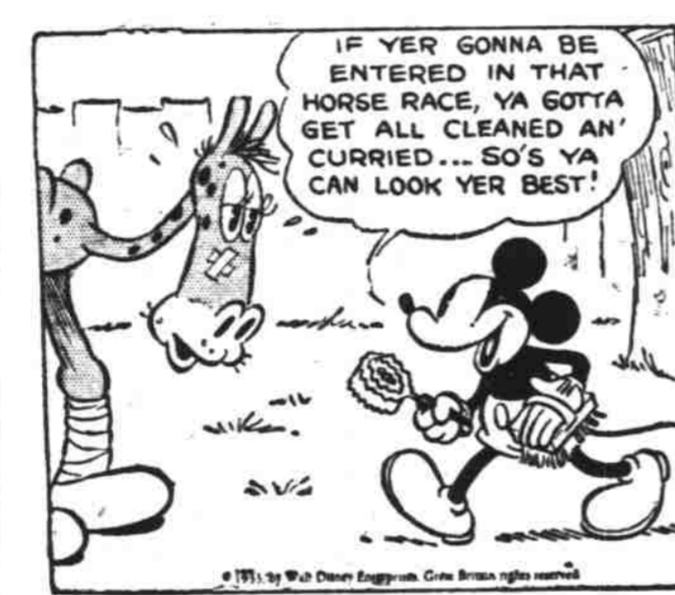
Cross-Word Puzzle

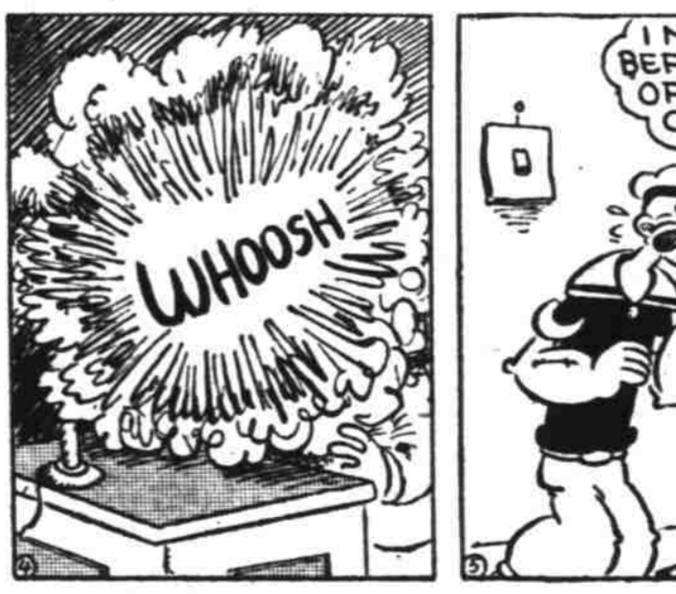
