Three Medford Ballot Thieves Are Dressed In

Arthur LaDieu, Walter Jones and Wesley McKittrick, involved in ballot thefts in Jackson county, arrived at the Oregon state penitentiary here yesterday to begin serving their terms.

LaDieu formerly was business manager of the Medford Daily News while Jones was mayor of Rogue River. They were sentenced to terms of four years each. McKittrick is under a one-year sentence.

The men were brought to Salem by Sheriff Olscheld and two deputies.

FUND FOR RAILROAD CROSSING DOUBTFUL

There is little prospect that the city of Salem will secure construction of an overhead or underground crossing of the Southern Pacific railroad tracks at the Pacific highway entrance to the municipality, out of federal public works funds, R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer, declared yesterday.

Baldock said he also doubted whether federal funds could be obtained for widening North Capitol street, fairgrounds and Portland road.

The highway commission and district engineer of the bureau of public roads originally had budgeted \$95,000 of federal city money to Salem. It was estimated that \$75,000 of this amount would be used for widening Capitol street and \$20,000 for improving

the south highway entrance to the city.

Baldock declared that while he favored the improvement he believed it would be impossible to obtain the money at this time.

Tax Exemption Amendment Put Before Voters

Every taxpayer in the state of Oregon would receive a tax exemption in the amount of \$1200 of the assessed valuation of his or her taxable property under the provisions of a proposed constitutional amendment filed in the offices of the secretary of state yesterday. The amendment would become effective, if passed, December 31, 1934. The proposed amendment was filed by the home owners tax exemption league, of which Charles H. Ager of Portland is president.

In case the completed petitions are filed by July 5, 1934, the amendment would be referred to the voters of Oregon at the general election in November of that year. The law provides that the petitions shall contain the signatures of 26,666 qualified voters.

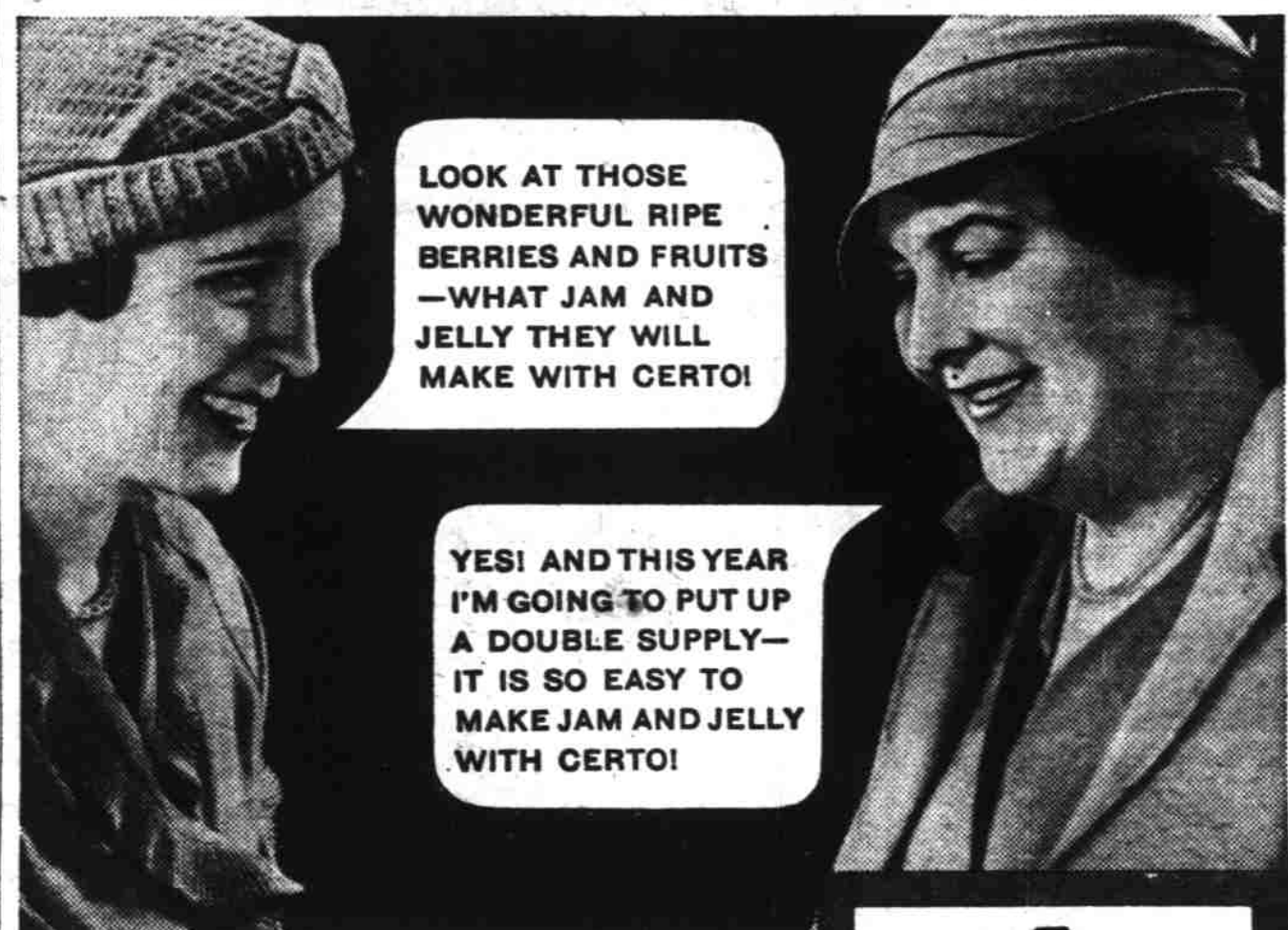
