

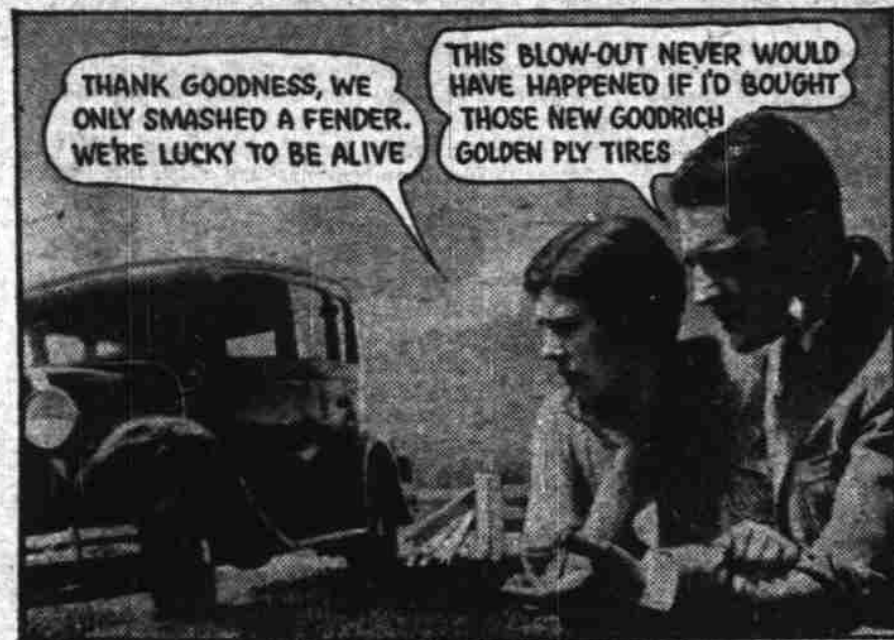
Threshing is Started in Unionvale Section

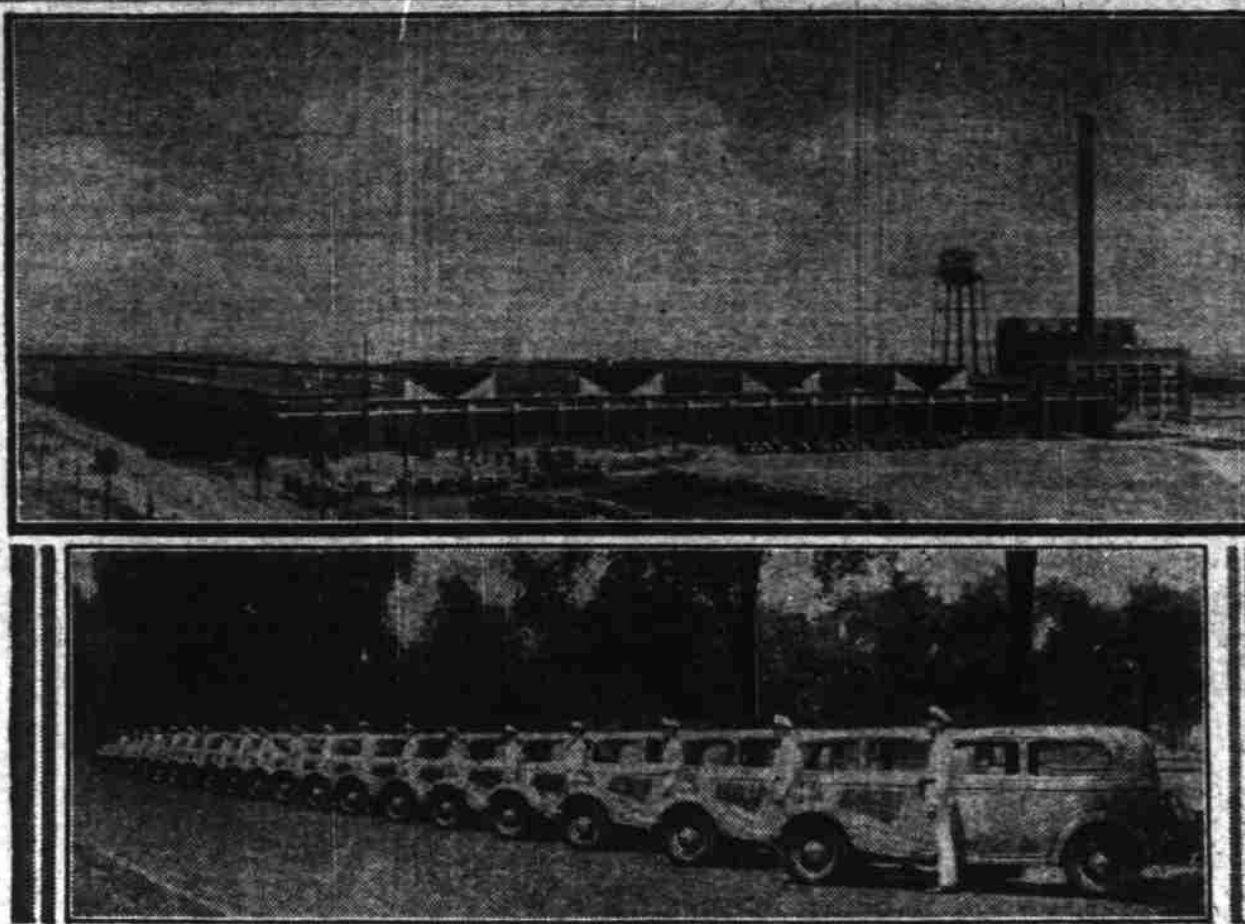
There was not one dollar's worth of breakage in the hotel during the period of the convention, which speaks for itself.

Economy measures undertaken by the postal service all over the nation are being sharply felt in the Salem postoffice where the volume of business has not dropped with the depression as it has in the majority of localities. Vacation vacancies formerly filled by substitute clerks and carriers are now carried by members of the regular staff on duty. Six carriers out of 27 are off duty this week either on vacations or furloughs; their routes have been divided off to other carriers. Vacations at the local postoffice are being taken in two and three day doses by many of the employees to ease the burdens on the stay-at-homes. Postmaster John H. Farrar said yesterday, however, that the work is being done in order and that the men are cheerful.

FAIR VISITORS INVITED TO VISIT FORD PLANT

BUILDING PERMITS ARE NOT EXTENSIVE

Permits issued Tuesday and Wednesday from the office of the city building inspector indicate an expenditure of \$4,428.40 in building activities in Salem during the next few weeks. Largest of these was taken out by T. E. Borkman, who will erect a one-story dwelling to cost \$2,675, at 310 N. 19th street.

The mill building of the Thomas Kay Woolen mills will be re-roofed at a cost of \$653.40. R. W. Craig will alter a two-story dwelling at 1320 Court street at a cost of \$400. E. B. Copeland will spend \$100 repairing a garage at 1906 Center.

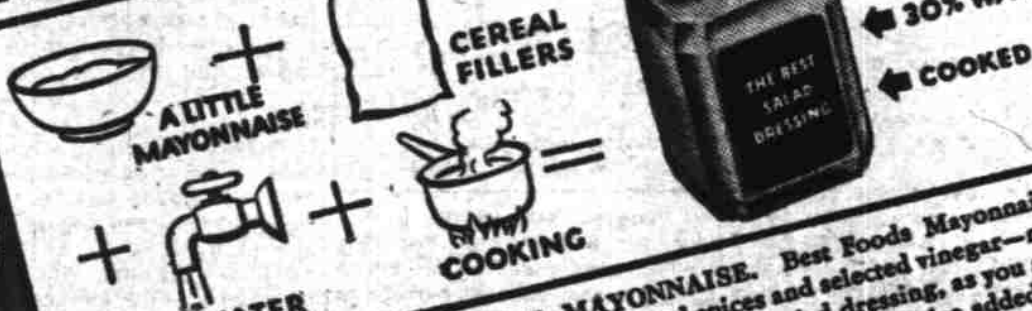
