1933 FILBERT CROP ESTIMATE 600 TONS

The 1933 filbert crop in Oregon, virtually the only producing section in the country, has been estimated at between 600 and 700 tons. Last year about 500 tons were harvested. At the nut growers' co-op association meeting here this week, prices on Barceonons were fixed with a range from 20 cents on jumbos to 13 cents for babies.

The annual filbert and walnut tour sponsored by the Western Nut Growers' association for all growers interested will be held Wednesday and Thursday, August 30 and 31, with the first day devoted to filbert groves and the second to walnuts.

The first day, growers will meet west of Gresham at Linemann Junction at 9:30 a. m., and in order to visit the plantings of Percy Glese, oldest in the northwest, J. E. Taylor, Frank Todd, afternoon, meeting at 1:30 o'clock in the city hall at Oregon City, and from there to Vonderhage Bros. grove and to H. Fisher and E. O. Fisher's plantings.

Thursday will be those of O. L. Griebler near Gaston, Otto Salzman, Dr. C. E. Hawks; and in the afternoon meeting at Scholl's, they will go to the Brown & McClure farm.
