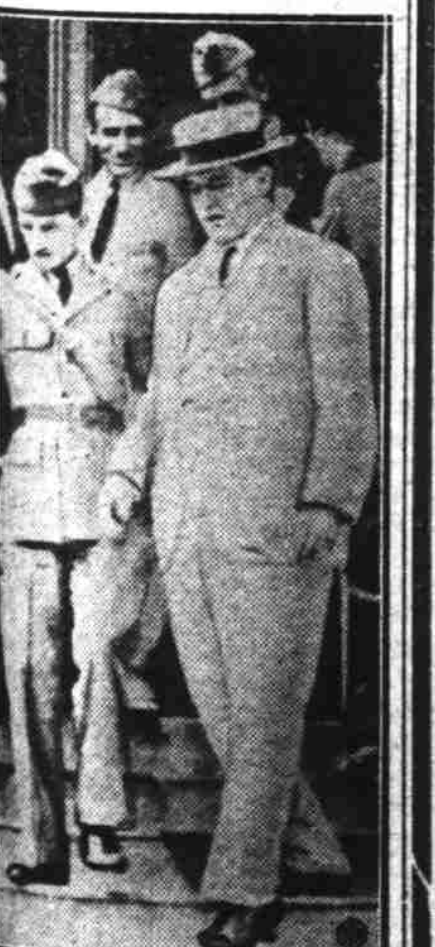
## Labor Day Calls Many on Trips
