### 3-CENT BREAK DIPS

### WHEAT MART APART

CHICAGO, Sept. 26.—(AP)—Ripped suddenly apart by more than 3 cents break in prices, the wheat market saw gains turned into losses late today.

The chief apparent reason was a quick reversal of market position by houses that earlier had been conspicuous buyers. Careful observers said news factors had no apparent effect, and that a general tendency was shown to avoid Washington administration developments regarding financial affairs.

Wheat closed unstable at nearly the day's bottom level, 2-3/4 cents below yesterday's finish, corn 1 1/2-1 3/4 down, oats at 1/4-1/2 decline.

### REVERSE FOLLOWS STOCKS' ADVANCE

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—(AP)—Stocks behaved indifferently today, advancing quietly until mid-afternoon when a drizzle of selling put the market into reverse and brought an irregularly lower close. Net changes were mostly fractional.

U. S. Smelting sagged 5. Allied Chemical rallied 4 but lost most of its rise. American Can sagged a point. People's Gas slumped 3 1/2.

There were small gains and losses for U. S. Steel, DuPont, Westinghouse, General Electric, General Motors, Consolidated Gas, Western Union, Bethlehem and most of the rails. American Telephone softened more than 2 points. Cerro de Pasco and National Distillers were each up a point at the finish. Chrysler eased 1 1/2.

Volume totaled 1,485,010 shares.
