Liver and Bacon
1 pound sliced liver
1-3 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon paprika
4 tablespoons bacon fat
6 strips bacon
Pour boiling water over liver and let stand 3 minutes. Drain and roll in flour. Heat bacon fat in frying pan. Add and quickly brown liver. Sprinkle with salt and paprika. Lay bacon strips in pan and cook until they are crisp and well browned and liver is very tender when tested with fork. It will require about 15 minutes of cooking.

Cold Slaw
2 egg yolks
2 tablespoons flour
4 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon mustard
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1-2 cup vinegar
1-3 cup water
3 cups chopped cabbage
Beat yolks and add dry ingredients. Add vinegar and water. Cook slowly and stir constantly until mixture thickens. Beat well. Cool. Add cabbage and serve.

Pecan Pie
1 baked pie shell
1/2 cup sugar
1-3 cup flour
2 cups milk

3 egg yolks
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon butter
1/2 cup pecans
3 egg whites, beaten
1-3 cup confectioner's sugar
Blend 1/2 cup of sugar with flour. Add milk, yolks and salt. Cook until thick and creamy in double boiler. Stir frequently while cooking. Add vanilla, butter and pecans. Pour in pie shell. Beat whites and when stiff add confectioner's sugar and beat until creamy. Roughly spread over top of filling. Bake 12 minutes in slow oven. Cool and serve.

Ham, English Style (Serving Four)
1 pound sliced ham
2 tablespoons mustard
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
3 tablespoons chopped onions
3 cups sliced potatoes
3 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 cups milk
Cut rind from ham. Fit ham into shallow baking pan. Spread with mustard and sprinkle with cloves, paprika and onions. Blend potatoes, flour and salt. Place on top ham. Add milk. Cover and bake 1 hour in moderate oven. Remove rind and have 10 minutes in hot oven to brown top. Serve in dish in which baked.

Baked Apples
4 apples
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 tablespoons butter
1 cup water
Core apples and fit into small baking pan. Add rest of ingredients and pour over top. Bake 40 minutes in moderate oven. Baste several times during baking.

Vegetable Salad
1 cup cooked green beans
1/2 cup cooked carrots
1/2 cup diced celery
2 tablespoons chopped onions
2 tablespoons chopped pickles
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup French Dressing
Mix and chill ingredients and serve on lettuce leaves.

French Dressing
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon mustard
1 teaspoon celery seed
3 tablespoons sugar
4 tablespoons vinegar
1/2 cup oil
2 tablespoons catsup
Mix ingredients in bottle. Cork and shake well. Store in ice box.

Hard Sauce
1-3 cup butter
1 1/2 cups confectioner's sugar
2 tablespoons hot cream
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
Mix ingredients and beat 2 minutes. Chill. Serve on warm pudding.

DONEY TO RECEIVE UNIQUE GIFT TODAY

Unique in the catalogue of gifts to the university is one which will be presented to President Carl Greg Doney of Willamette today. Combining sentiment, beauty and practicality in one small package, Wendell M. Keck, graduate of Willamette with the class of 1930 has prepared entirely by hand a new copy of "Farewell Willamette", university hymn sacred to seniors and their commencement activities.

Mr. Keck's gift, tendered in honor of his class, the fiftieth to use the song at its graduation ceremonies, is bound in the old university's colors, red and gold; words and music of the song are hand inscribed with beautiful uniformity on cream ledger paper in lasting India ink.

An especially notable feature of the folder is the page allotted to autographs of soloists elected by their various classes to sing the hymn and their accompanists. Space has been provided for the signature of each singer from the class of '30 to the class of '60, with the lines for the soloist and accompanist in 1944 drawn in red in preparation for the probable celebration at that time of the centennial of the founding of the university.

Already the autographs of seven women appear there with only one missing since 1930. Elizabeth Ogden, who sang the hymn in 1932, lives in Portland and teaches in the Bay City high school and has been unable to come to Salem and affix her signature but she has been notified and will, sometime during the coming year, fill the vacancy. Before 1930 classes had usually elected men to sing the farewell song but the names in the new copy are all those of women: Lillian Scott, '30 and her accompanist, Helen Price '30; Josephine Albert and Rosalind Van Winkle, '31; Edith Findley, accompanist, '32; Elizabeth Clement and Marjory O'Dell, '33.

The university's farewell hymn, composed by J. R. Bain, '16, and Paul Irvine, '15, has never been printed and, following tradition, never will be. The single copy is kept in the university safe and handed out from year to year to the seniors elected by their fellows as representative of the class in the field of song. It is sung each year by only one member of the graduating class and always with the request that there be no applause for it is looked upon as a hymn.

A pen and ink drawing sketching the bell-tower of historic Waller hall appears on the red cover of the new copy, and the name of the first singer takes its place in the title "Farewell Willamette as Sung by Harold B. Jory, '15". The work was begun a year ago and has occupied a good many of Mr. Keck's spare moments during the past two summer vacations.

Indict Attorney For Failure to Report on Gold

NEW YORK, Sept. 27. — (AP) — Violation of President Roosevelt's gold hoarding orders was charged in a federal indictment today against Frederick Barber Campbell, wealthy attorney, who has filed a civil suit to test the orders constitutionality.

Campbell, a director in numerous English and American insurance companies, was specifically charged with failing to file a report on \$200,574 in gold bullion.

United States Attorney George Z. Medalla and an assistant, Thomas E. Dewey, presented the evidence to the grand jury and the indictment was quickly returned.
