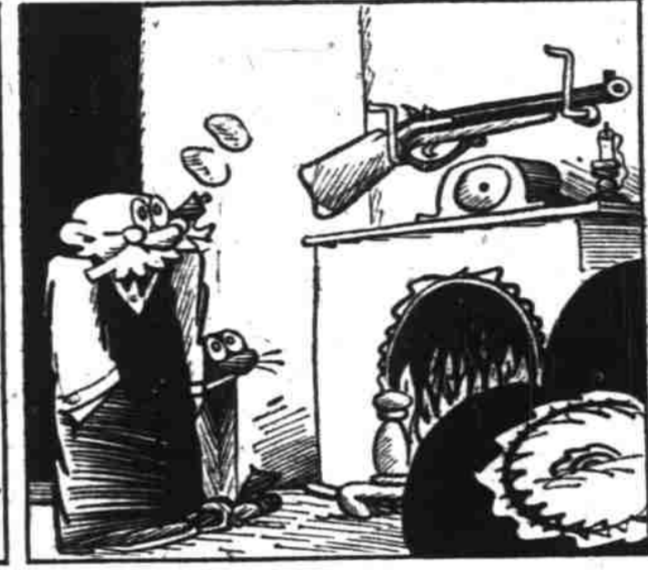

Philharmonic to Give Benefit Bridge

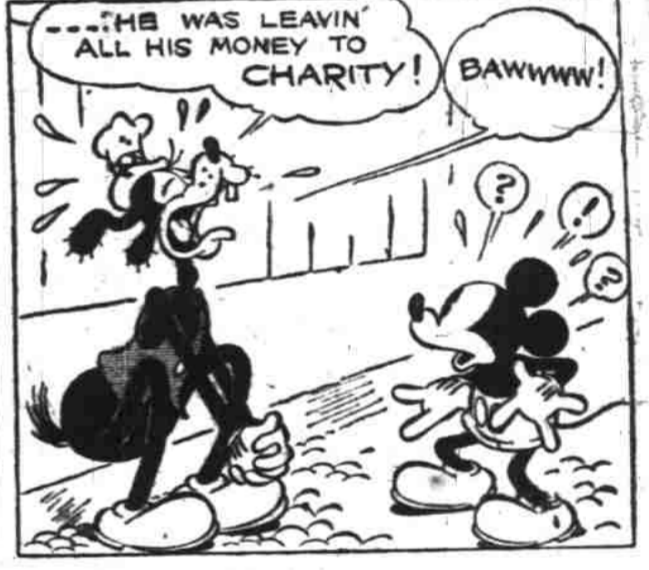
A benefit bridge tea will be sponsored by the Salem Philharmonic association Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Woman's club house.

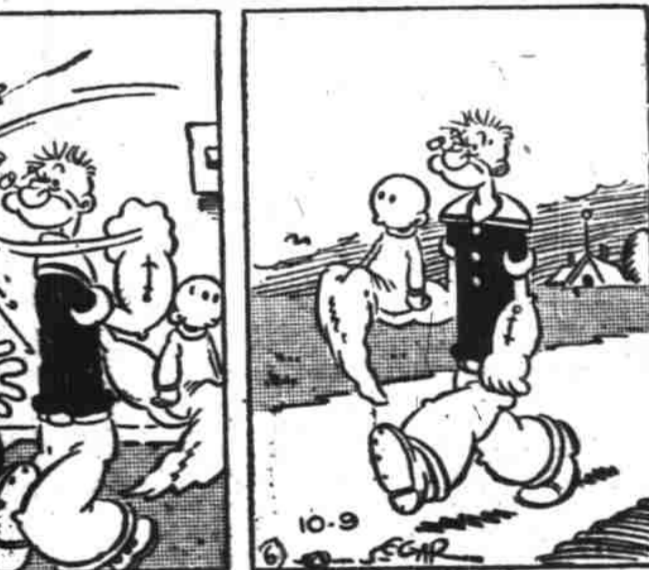

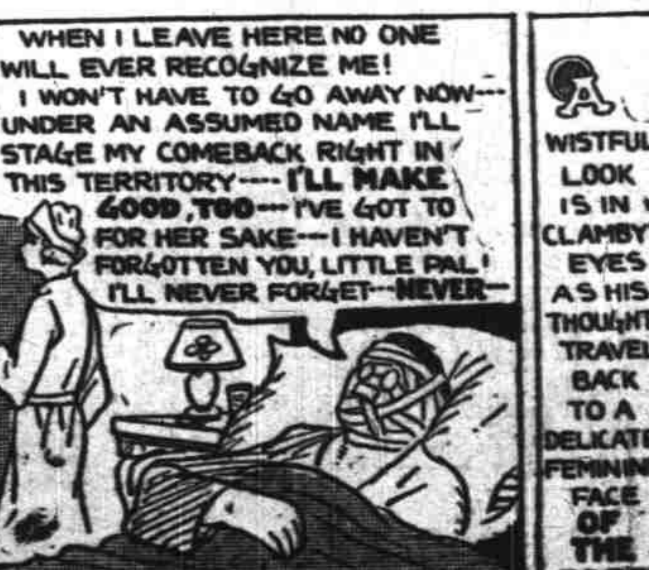
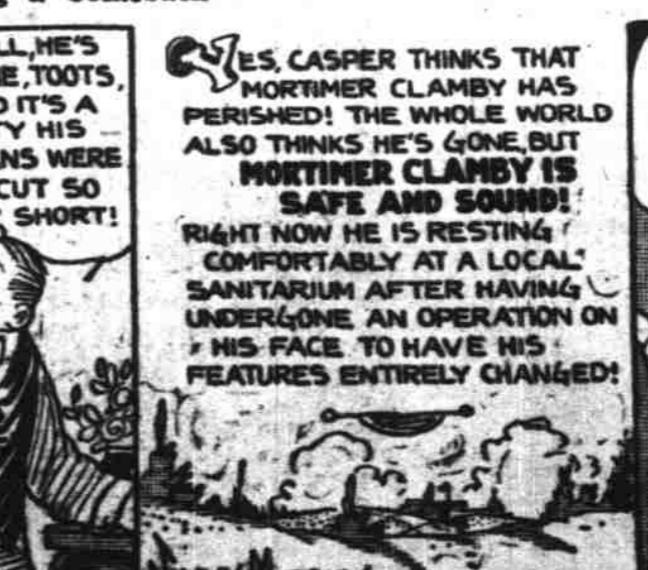
