

HARMONIZING CODES IS LATEST EFFORT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—(AP)—An agreement to harmonize the codes promulgated separately by the administration's key recovery agencies was reached today by their administrators for early consideration by President Roosevelt.

It was developed at a long conference of Secretary Wallace, Farm Administrator George N. Peek and Hugh S. Johnson, the NRA administrator, and will affect directly the distribution codes pending before the farm and industrial agencies.

The three men reported they had succeeded in getting together on "fundamental policies," including points of difference that have developed over the distribution codes with their proposals for minimum markups aimed to end price-cutting wars.

300 Manchurian Bandits Killed, Japanese Claim

TOKYO, Friday, Oct. 13.—(AP)—The Osaka newspaper Asahi said today 300 Manchurian bandits were slain and sixteen Japanese soldiers killed or wounded in the sharpest battle in months in Manchuria, which began four days ago near Ghinshi.

Reports said a Japanese detachment clashed with 1000 bandits. Lieutenant Ito, leader of the hard-pressed Japanese forces, was reported killed.

Reinforcements, including an airplane from Chinchow, arrived two days after the battle began and turned the tide against the outlaws.

AUDIT IS ORDERED IN MAIZELS CASE

Otto Kabin, state auditor, will today begin a thoroughgoing check of all the records of the state board of control dealing with collection of moneys for the care of patients at the state hospitals for the insane.

The special audit was necessitated by the admitted delinquencies of Albert G. Maizels, 22, clerk in the department, who admitted taking \$2052 within the last 16 months.

Sentence of Maizels, who pleaded guilty before Judge L. H. McMahon on Wednesday, will be held up until the audit is completed. Friends of Maizels have raised the amount of money he allegedly took to repay the state.

Maizels is free under an order requiring him to report daily to District Attorney Trindle.

It was learned yesterday his wife, who he married September 10 at an elaborate wedding in Portland, has given up her rings given by him then, to help repay the embezzled moneys.

Five Survivors Of Sea Tragedy Arrive at Port

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Lone survivors of a grim tragedy of the sea, five Greek sailors, reached port today aboard a rescue vessel, telling of a terrific hurricane which sent their ship, the freighter Annoula, and 26 of their mates to the ocean's bottom.

They were picked up Sunday night by the Italian steamship Montello, in a thrilling rescue, after spending 36 hours in a small open boat, battered by raging Atlantic seas and drifting they knew not where.
