ROSEBURG, Ore., Oct. 26. (P)—The "dead eye" shot of an intrepid 14-year-old boy recently saved the life of Mrs. Harvey Potter, wife of a farmer living near here, when she was attacked by a wounded bear, it became known here today. Mrs. Potter, using a light calibre rifle, shot the large bear, which had been killing her sheep. Only wounded, the animal charged down upon her.
Meredith Roberts, 14, attracted by the shooting, ran to a nearby home, seized a larger rifle and shot twice at the onrushing brute. The second shot took effect. The animal paused momentarily, and Mrs. Potter, at close range, fired the final shot that killed the intruder.

Queer Fog Held Cause of Rumor Volcano Erupts

ELLENSBURG, Wash., Oct. 26. (P)—What state normal school scientists claim to be an unusual fog formation, billowing from Mount Stuart, 9400-foot peak of granite in the Wenatchee range, since daylight today, caused hundreds of phone calls into the Ellensburg newspaper office from excited Yakima valley residents, who believed there was an eruption at the mountain.
The formation, of a dark color, rose hundreds of feet into the air and floated off to the northwest. About 8:30 a.m. the color changed to a steam haze and an hour later had turned back to dark again. Scores phoned that the top of the peak had blown off and the ragged mountain had changed its formation.

Albany is Paid For Vandalism Of Salem Lads

Damages amounting to \$8.50 for injuries incurred by Albany high school properties at Friday night's game here in a fracas said to have been led by a former Salem high student were paid by the Salem high school student body yesterday upon receipt of a bill from Principal Hudson of Albany high school.
Accompanying the payment was a note of apology; local student body as hosts for the game accepted responsibility although leaders here said students did not ruin caps belonging to Albany band members or throw a rock through the windshield of the Albany high school bus parked on Winter street near Lausanne hall during the game on Sweetland field.

CLAIM BANK FAILS TO PROTECT PUBLIC

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26. (P)—A lack of effort to protect the security-buying public was laid directly to Chase National bank officials today by Senator Couzens (R., Mich.) before the senate banking committee in the concluding session of its inquiry into Cuban loans by the bank.
His declarations followed the disclosure to the committee by Ferdinand Pecora, its counsel, of huge profits in floating bonds to finance public works in Cuba, and a Chase officer's report that there was considerable graft in spending the money.
Coincidentally, Pecora developed that Sumner Welles, President Roosevelt's appointee to succeed

Harry Guggenheim as ambassador to Cuba, stopped in New York to talk things over with Chase executives, who found him "standoffish" toward them.
Couzens, as the Cuban inquiry drew to a close, gave his views to the bank officials in commenting on evidence to show that bond buyers were made to believe special revenues were set aside to meet the obligations, but that the funds were not segregated in the treasury.
