PUMPKIN PIE RECIPE

Dinner Menu

(Serving Four)

Escalloped Rice and Tomatoes

Baked Sweet Potatoes

Bread Butter

Escalloped Rice and Tomatoes

4 tablespoons chopped bacon

3 tablespoons chopped onions

3 cups boiled rice

2 cups tomatoes

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon paprika

2 tablespoons butter

1/2 cup crumbs

Heat bacon in frying pan, add

and brown onions, celery and

rice. Add rest of ingredients and

boil 2 minutes. Pour into butter-

ed, shallow baking dish. Bake 30

minutes in moderate oven.

French Dressing

(Always keep some stored in

refrigerator)

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon mustard

1 teaspoon paprika

1 teaspoon onion juice

1 tablespoon sugar

4 tablespoons vinegar

1/2 cup salad oil

Mix ingredients in bottle. Cork

and shake 1 minute. Store in ice

box and shake well before pour-

ing over salads.

Pumpkin Pie—Crust

1 cup flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1-3 cup lard

2 tablespoons cold water

Mix flour and salt. Cut in lard

with knife. Mixing with knife,

add water slowly. Exact amount

of water cannot be determined, so add it very carefully. When stiff dough forms, shape it into ball and then roll out thin and fit into deep pie pan. Add pump-

kin filling.

Pumpkin Filling

1 cup mashed cooked pumpkin

1 cup sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon

2-3 teaspoon cloves

2-3 teaspoon nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 eggs

1 cup milk

1 tablespoon butter, melted

Mix ingredients and pour into

pie shell. Bake 15 minutes in

moderately hot oven. Reduce heat

to moderately slow and bake 40

minutes.
