In his latest picture, "Too Much Harmony," now at the Elsinore theatre, Bing Crosby plays the role of a Broadway crooning star who is engaged to marry a gold-digging blonde. When Bing sees a little vaudeville doing Broadway stuff in a cheap theatre in the "sticks," he gets her a chance in his new show, even if he has to take along her dumb vaudeville partners. They fall in love and everybody is pretty unhappy all around, for the girl is engaged to one of the old vaudeville team. But this pair of comers put their empty heads together and evolve a scheme to set things right. How they do it furnishes the high-spot of the picture.

In supporting roles are Jack Oakie and Skeets Gallagher, the famous comedy team who wowed audiences in "Close Harmony" several years ago; Judith Allen, Cecil B. ## 'BERKELEY SQUARE' FEATURE AT GRAND

Leslie Howard Well Cast in  
Story That Reverts to  
Late 18th Century

Peter Standish mingles with his ancestors in "Berkeley Square," which comes to the screen of the Grand theatre today and will remain for an engagement of four days. Jesse L. Lasky should be commended for the sound judgment he manifested in obtaining the services of Leslie Howard for the role. It is one of the most completely charming films to have come from Hollywood.

Picture if you can, Peter Standish, a modern young man of 1933, becoming so absorbed in the diary of an ancestor of his own name, that he cannot think of anything but the glorious days of the 18th century. When he returns from visiting some of his friends he is found at the door of his residence in Berkeley Square. Upon reaching the door he beholds the modern Peter Standish suddenly transformed into the Peter Standish of 150 years ago. As a modern man taking the place of his 18th century relative, he meets his own ancestors, speaks to some as if he were already dead and amazes everyone by talking of events in history that have not yet occurred.

He finds himself engaged to a cousin, Kate—but falls in love with her sister, Helen. Yet he knows from the old diary that he must marry Kate. For a brief time they are happy, even in a love that is hopeless.

If you enjoy a performance that is finished and perfectly handled, do not fail to see Leslie Howard's portrayal of Peter Standish in "Berkeley Square." Heather Angel plays the leading feminine role opposite Howard. Pretty, tender and appealing, Miss Angel's performance is superb.

## 'FOOTLIGHT PARADE' HERE NEXT SUNDAY

With a cast headed by a dozen popular screen favorites and including 250 of the most beautiful girls in the world, "Footlight Parade," Warner Bros. gigantic musical successor to "42nd Street" and "Gold Diggers of 1933," will arrive on the screen of the Elsinore theatre Sunday, November 12.

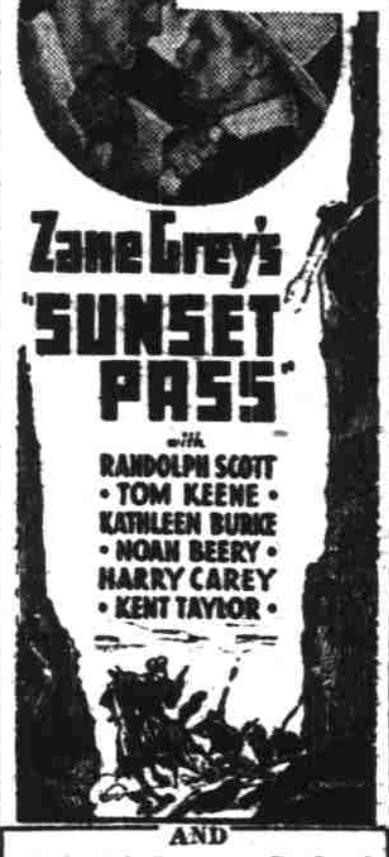

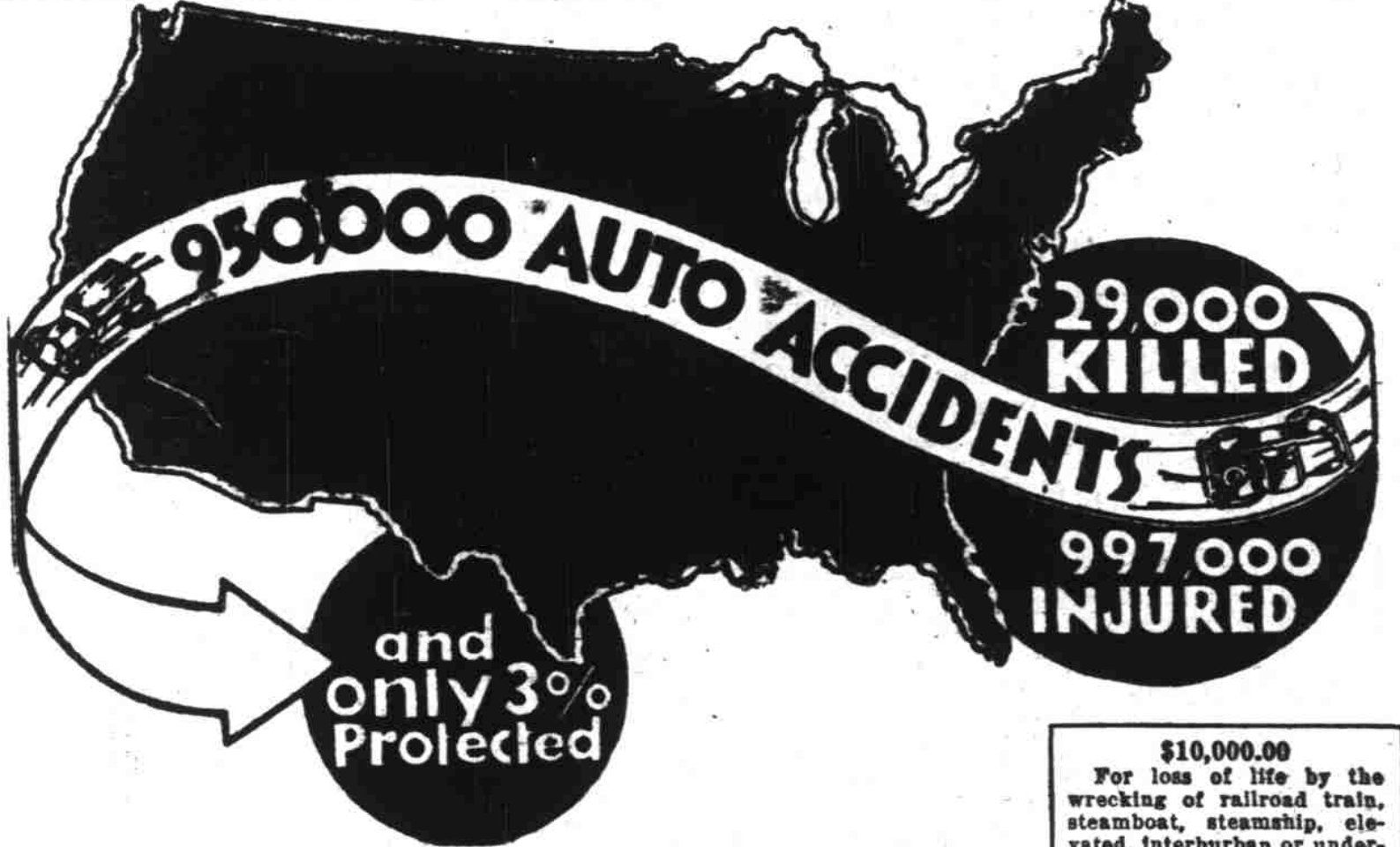
## NORMAL GRIDSTERS DEFEAT CHICO 20-0
