not the committee's "emasculated" proposal. The majority and minority reports, each many pages in length, were rushed last night to the state printer who is expected to have each report on the members' desks this morning when they return to the senate which convenes at 9:30 a. m. The divided report is expected to come up by 10 a. m. and thereon a major senate debate will be precipitated.

Senator John Goss will move, it is understood, to send the bill to committee with orders that his drug store-grocery sale plan for hard liquor handling be incorporated.

Should the Goss motion not prevail, a determined attempt will be made to get the senate into committee of a whole to revise the entire bill. If this attempt fails, the final debate will be on the divided reports. If the majority report prevails, the Knox plan is virtually assured of approval by the senate.

Bus-Truck Measure Ready for Action

The senate roads and highways committee, working late into the night, was to report this morning favorably on HB 86, the bus and truck measure. A few amendments will be offered.

Last night Senator Francisco introduced into the upper assembly a measure deemed to clarify the uncertainty over the Knox rule controversy occasioned by the attorney-general's ruling last yesterday. Under Francisco's proposal, the legislature would provide by law that the repeal of a constitutional amendment which had repealed a former amendment, did not revive the latter. The Clatsop county senator contends the legislature has the power thus to instruct the court on a mooted point.

Sensor Francisco held the attorney-general's opinion invalid legislation dealing with the proper court interpretation of the moot question of revival of repealed statutes. The Astoria senator cited the phrase from the attorney-general's opinion running: "In the absence of legislation or judicial determination in this state," Francisco inferred that legislation against the resurrection of repealed statutes would block such an interpretation by the courts.

City Taxation Bill Passed by House

The house last night passed its bill 34 permitting cities to tax business and professions. Representative J. H. Egan held the measure necessary to keep cities operating where real property collection had proved impossible. It passed HB 63 making slight changes in the tax collection law.

Thirty and twenty were rallied for HB 62 but five members were absent and 25 voted no so the measure failed to carry. Representative Estes Snedecor contended the measure would bring \$100,000 more into the state's treasury annually by reducing the property tax offset on corporation excise taxes from 90 to 50 percent. He held that the provision would equalize the law's provisions on personal and corporate income taxes.

The house passed the Johnson bill which gives the state control of all liquor coming into Oregon pending the enactment of a state liquor control measure. The liquor may be taken by the state liquor commission by paying its owner the cost price.

Santiam River Rises Rapidly As Rain Comes

JEFFERSON, Dec. 7 — The torrential rains of Tuesday and Tuesday night brought the Santiam river to rise rapidly. Wednesday it was up to the 11.7 mark. It was thought to have reached the 12-foot mark during Tuesday night. The shed in which the tools and cement were kept and shelter for workmen for the relief work, was blown down during the terrific wind. A telephone pole in falling, almost crashed into C. J. Thurston's new house in the south part of town, but was held up by one wire. The Mountain States emergency crew replaced the pole. Two stained glass windows were broken in the Evangelical church. Otherwise no serious damage was reported.

DEALERS URGE USE OF BLACK GASOLINE

EUGENE, Dec. 7. (AP) — The proposed sale of "black gasoline" to operators of stationary engines, tractors and similar equipment was favored in a resolution adopted here today by delegates attending the meeting of the Oregon State Independent Gasoline and Oil Dealers' association.

Fifty members of the organization from all parts of the state attended the session.

The dealers said that the use of black gasoline would permit a more thorough check on users of this type of fuel. They declared that the state highway commission now budgets \$800,000 annually for gasoline rebates to operators of tractors and stationary engines, the dealers expressing the belief that at least \$300,000 of this amount is unfairly obtained through the use of this gas in private automobiles.

Under present conditions, it was said, state officers cannot check this use, but with the use of "black gas" they could more easily determine when it was being used in private cars.
