

LOUISIANANS BALK,
NEW ELECTION PLAN

BATON ROUGE, La., Dec. 7 (AP)—Definite rejection of Governor Oscar K. Allen's offer to call a sixth district congressional election April 15, 1934, that would cancel the projected Long-Allen, December 5 "election" and obviate the citizens' independent balloting set for December 27, was announced late today by the citizens' election committee.

The rejection rendered virtually certain the poll arranged by citizens' mass meeting and thrown open to all candidates, despite proposals from several quarters that would have resulted in its being called off, and which would likewise have erased the result of Tuesday's bitterly re-elected balloting in which Mrs. Bolivar E. Kemp, as the only democratic "nominee" was "elected" to her late husband's congressional seat without a primary.

Governor Allen, in offering to set a general election next April as the earliest date legally possible, was declared by the citizens' election committee to have "as usual, dodged the issue."

The committee then said the December 27 vote "called by the people" would be held.

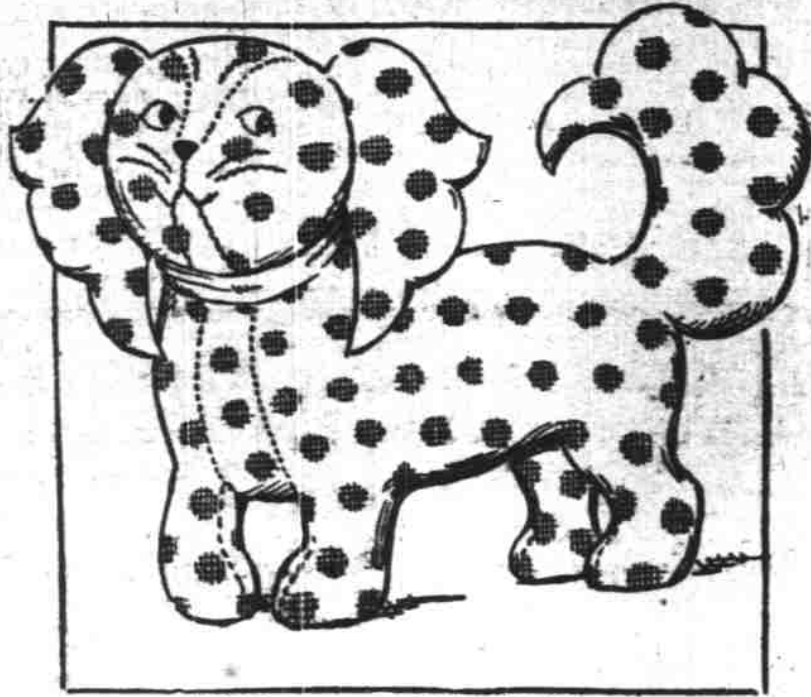

N. Y. POST IS SOLD
TO J. DAVID STERN

NEW YORK, Dec. 7 (AP)—J. David Stern, publisher of the Philadelphia Record, announced tonight he had purchased the New York Evening Post.

Mr. Stern in announcing his purchase, said he bought outright all the common stock held by the Curtis - Martin Publishing company in the Post. Mr. Stern said that a block of the preferred non-voting stock of the newspaper could continue to be held by Curtis-Martin.

Mr. Stern, in addition to the Philadelphia Record, owns the Courier-Post Newspapers, Inc., of Camden, N. J.

He said in his formal announcement that no personnel changes were contemplated and that the Post would be independent politically as have "all the seven other papers I have owned."

The life story of the New York Evening Post is intertwined with the history of the republic. The United States was a babe among nations when Alexander Hamilton founded the paper in 1801.

The paper grew with the country and now, at the age of 132 years, it is looked upon as the oldest large-city daily of unchanged name in the United States.
