PROFITING CANCELED

51-4 CENT INCREASE

CHICAGO, Dec. 11. (AP)—Stimulated by a sudden cold wave arousing crop damage fears, wheat rose today to 5 1/2 cents above last week's low, but profiting virtually cancelled gains.

Almost total absence of snow protection, combined with 40 degree drop in temperature, gave ground for uneasiness regarding the domestic wheat crop outlook, especially in the southwest. Notice was also taken of 3,785,000 bushels decrease of the United States wheat visible supply, with total stocks the smallest since 1927.

Wheat closed unsettled at the same as Saturday's finish to 1/2 higher, cent unchanged to 1/2 lower, oats 1/2 up.
