EGGS OFF 2 CENTS ON LOCAL MARKET

CHICAGO, Dec. 13. (AP)—Overcome by pressure of liquidating sales in a market bare of buyers, wheat tumbled today to a maximum of 4 1/2 cents under Monday's top level.

Grade B raw 4% milk, co-op pool price, \$1.32 per hundred. Surplus \$1.15. (All based on semi-monthly butterfat average.)

Eggs dropped two cents per dozen on the local market Wednesday, to take a price of 17 cents on extras. Mediums and standards are quoted at 13 cents and pullets at nine cents.

Portland, Dec. 13. (AP)—General weakness in the butter trade has continued today and lower prices were again predicted by leaders of the industry as heavy supplies of storage stock remained in coolers, and a record seasonal make was reported throughout the country.

Prices paid to growers by Salem buyers December 13 (The prices below, suggested by a local grower, are indicative of the market as set by the Oregon State Grains and Feed Commission.)

Wheat also dropped with red at 56 cents and white at 57 cents. Livestock was steady. In the fruit line, California grapefruit is lower by 50 cents a crate, navel oranges are down 25 cents a crate and Emperor grapes, the only offering in this fruit, are higher at \$1.50.
