"Sugarplum Season" Here So Make Sweetmeats Now

It is likely that the author of the famous "Night Before Christmas" who wrote:

"and visions of sugarplums danced in their heads..." was thinking about dates, stuffed to a fullness with juicy nutmeats and glistening with mounds of snowy sugar, for these are the sugarplums of today's children and it wouldn't be Christmas without them. Let's start making them now!

Grown in biblical lands, right on the site of what was the Garden of Eden, dates are linked to Christmas by tradition as well as taste.

Since they are as good days later as when they are first made, stuffed dates may be prepared well in advance of the holidays. Full directions are given here for the novice and the seasoned members of the sugarplum sorority will welcome the new recipes provided.

Stuffed Dates
The favorite stuffings for dates are: nutmeats, plain, sugared or salted; fruit paste; fondants; and marshmallows. To stuff dates, pit the 10-ounce packages of dates, being sure to get the pasteurized variety, or use the ready-pitted kind. It is usually desirable to leave a bit of stuffing visible, although date may be wrapped entirely around the filling to keep it moist. After stuffing, sugar dates by shaking a few at a time in a paper bag containing granulated sugar; or dates may be rolled in chopped nutmeats after stuffing. Some new fillings are:

Fondant (Uncooked)
1-3 cups confectioner's sugar
1 1/2 tbsps. butter
1-8 tsp. vanilla or other flavoring
Cream to moisten

Cream butter and sugar together with a fork. Add flavoring and enough cream to make paste of proper consistency for stuffing. Stuff dates, leaving some of the fondant exposed. Roll dates in sugar.

Variations for Fondant Stuffing
Melted chocolate may be added to plain fondant for chocolate fondant.

Fondant may be colored any desired pastel shade with food coloring. Flavoring of various types may also be used such as rose, almond, peppermint. Suit the coloring to the flavors used.

Chopped nutmeats may be added to the fondant, or a half nutmeat pressed into the fondant.

Orange Peanut Butter
1-3 cup peanut butter (1/4 lb.)
5 tbsps orange juice
orange rind

Candied orange peel or grated
Add orange juice slowly to peanut butter; mix well. Add 1/2 teaspoon grated orange rind or a tablespoon candied orange peel. Stuff dates and roll in sugar or in finely chopped salted peanuts.

Marshmallow Coconut
Cut 1/4 lb. fresh marshmallows into quarters with scissors. Stuff each date with a piece of the marshmallow, placing cut side up. Dip sticky surface of marshmallows into shredded coconut.
