NEW YORK, Dec. 19. (AP)—Shadows of the impending holidays hover over the financial markets today, bringing dullness and narrow price changes.

Howe Sound moved higher in response to its increased dividend, American Agricultural Chemical, United Fruit, Allied Chemical, Associated Oil and Brooklyn.

Manhattan Transit gained a point or two, but elsewhere net changes were largely fractional.

U. S. Steel, Union Carbide, duPont, General Motors, Chrysler, Santa Fe and Sears Roebuck finished steady to firm.

American Telephone, better supported than of late, was down slightly. General Electric, Consolidated Gas, Westinghouse and North American were down moderately.

Union Pacific, U. S. Smelting and National Distillers Products lost about a point.

Transactions totaled 1,025,570 shares.

Firm Tone Comes to Grains

SOUTHWEST RAINS FAIL TO RELIEVE

Salem Markets

CHICAGO, Dec. 19. (AP)—A firm tone distinguished the grain markets late today, reports indicating that downpours southwest had failed to relieve wheat areas where moisture was most needed.

Helping to put backbone into wheat values were authoritative advices that the 1933 wheat production of four Danubian countries, Hungary and Yugoslavia, had been officially overestimated 33,000,000 bushels.

Some buying appeared based on circumstantial reports from Washington that the administration was drafting a plan to devalue the dollar, balance the federal budget, and stabilize the currency on a modified gold basis.

Wheat closed mixed, 1/4 off to 1/2 up, compared with yesterday's finish, corn unchanged to 1/4 advance, oats at 1/4 decline to 1/4 advance.
