ing time next year in getting out of state debts for highways; it has made a good stride this year by a net reduction of fully two millions.

There would be no legal restriction on a \$2,000,000 bond issue by the commission in 1934. While the 1933 regular session legislated against additional highway bonds it provided that refunding issues could be sold and that bonds could also be sold to meet federal funds.

This much is certain, the appetite for new and improved roads is almost insatiable. The engineers' plans for the \$15,000,000 PWA program which was a still-born child, showed they many gaps there were to the "ideal" state highway system. The East and West Side Pacific highways are in process of face-lifting; only a start has been made on the forehead of these arterial roads. The coast highway is ready for remodeling in stretches only a year after the entire road is open. The North and South Santiam entreat for more construction funds. The road or roads to the coast from Portland will be huge wells for new funds until once they are stricken and the metropolitan cry for a speedy road to the coast is hushed. DAYTON, Dec. 21. — All stock in pastures along rivers in this section has been rounded up ready to move to higher location in case of a sudden rise which is not feared at this time. The last few days' rain, while filling rivers full, has not attained flood stage here.

DALLAS, Dec. 21. — With the continuance of the steady rain of the past few days Polk county's streams were swelled to the point of overflowing their banks and traffic on the highways was slowed up somewhat due to the high water. Surface water covered the highway between here and Salem in several places but was not deep enough to imperil traffic. The road was marked and watchmen were on hand to warn motorists to drive slowly while going through the low areas.

Several country roads were flooded but traffic could get through most of them. The LaCrosse river was overflowing in some places near here and was endangering some homes on the lowlands but the stream has not reached the high water mark of a few weeks ago.

Cecil Riggs states that his rain gauge has shown that the fall has averaged better than 1.5 inches a day since last Sunday. The nearest approach to the present rainfall since Mr. Riggs has been measuring the fall was in 1917 when the fall for the entire month of December was 14.54 inches. So far this month the rain, according to Mr. Riggs' figures, totals 19.65 inches.

pupil, Mr. Howard believes.

One of the very apparent effects of the tax would be to distribute more money into the rural districts, since retail sales tend to be congregated in the larger areas. Thus rural or small-town schools will receive a much larger return from the sales tax than the amount of tax collected in their own community. Mr. Howard's estimated receipts and tax reductions in various districts in the county, follows:

board. All women CWS puts to work must be drawn from the list of persons eligible for relief.

Other jobs at which women may later be placed under CWS include employment in relief offices, interviewing, sewing, vocational and adult education. Mr. Niles was uninformed as to whether or not this would mean that the expected unemployed teacher relief program through organizing adult education classes at the high school here would come under civil works service.

Hours of work for the women

have not been definitely determined, according to Niles, but undoubtedly will be somewhat above the 30 hour maximum week permitted on CWA projects.

Tentative applications for two other CWS projects were known of here. One is compiling Indian war muster records, which now exist in the original handwriting at the national guard adjutant general's office here. The other, sought by a University of Oregon research bureau, is surveying light and water rates in the various Oregon municipalities.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 21. (AP)—An ambitious presentation of Handel's Oratorio, "The Messiah," sung by 500 persons from the choirs of 32 Portland churches with the Portland Symphony orchestra filling in the instrumental background, will be Portland's promise to the celebration of Christmas.

The Oratorio will be given at the Portland civic auditorium Sunday under the baton of Dr. Willem van Hoogstraten, internationally known conductor of the Portland Symphony orchestra. The chorus will be the largest yet to appear with the orchestra.

Individual churches throughout the city are arranging special services for Christmas day. Charity and other welfare organizations are planning extensive entertainments and distribution of gifts for the less fortunate.
