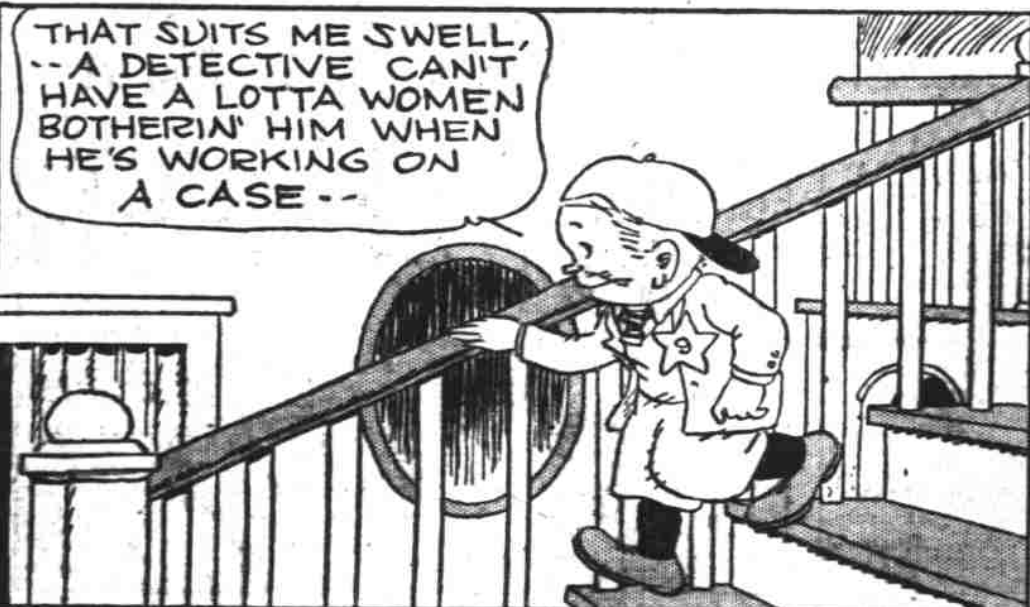
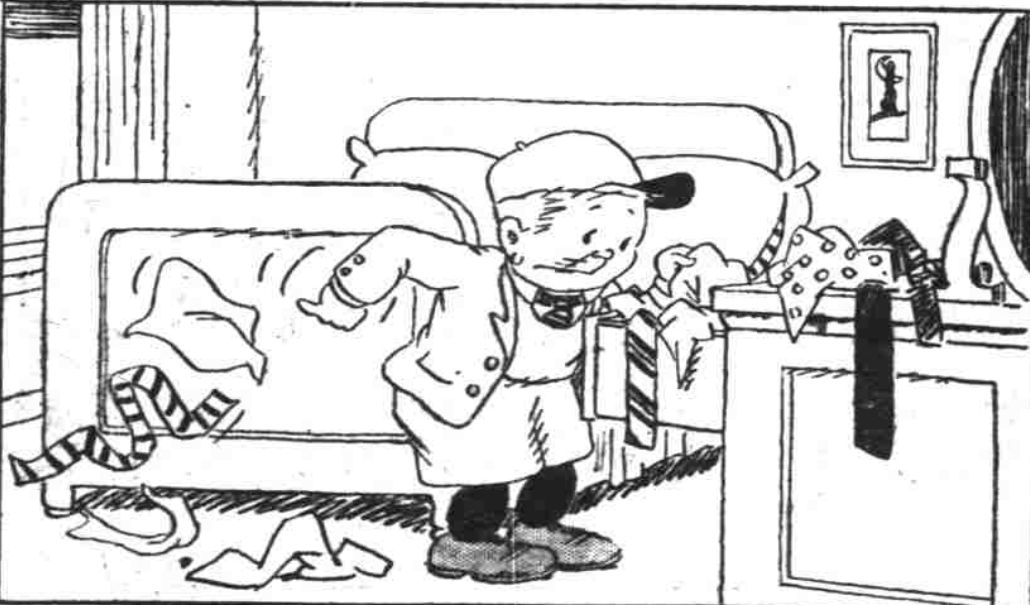
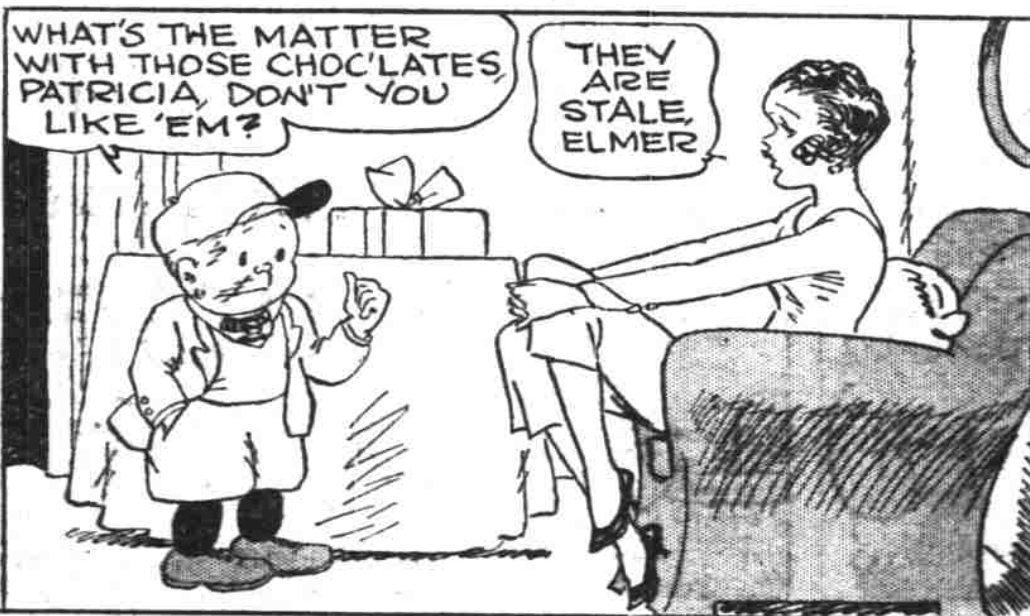
The Elmer Game



POTATO GOLF THE COURSE OR PLAYING FIELD IS MADE BY PLACING NINE CARDBOARD DISKS, ABOUT 4 INCHES IN DIAMETER, AROUND THE ROOM. THESE DISKS ARE NUMBERED 1 TO 9 IN ORDER IN WHICH THE "HOLES" ARE PLAYED, PILLOWS ARE PLACED BETWEEN AND BEFORE THE DISKS FOR HAZARDS. THE PLAYERS ARE DIVIDED INTO TEAMS OF TWO EACH. EACH PLAYER IS PROVIDED WITH A SMALL, ROUND POTATO AND A TABLESPOON. THE POTATO MUST BE HIT OR DRIVEN, WITH THE SPOON ONTO EACH OF THE DISKS, THE DISK MUST SHOW ON ALL SIDES OF THE POTATO BEFORE A PLAYER CAN CLAIM TO HAVE PLAYED THE HOLE. EACH PLAYER KEEPS A SEPARATE SCORE OF STROKES TAKEN TO COMPLETE THE NINE HOLES, THIS IS ADDED TO THAT OF HIS TEAM-MATE, THE TEAM HAVING THE LOWEST SCORE WINS.
