LABISH ONION MART RISES 10C TO \$1.50

LABISH CENTER, Jan. 9. -This week's onion sales have started with a 10-cent advance over the previous week, buyers offering \$1.60 a hundred, sacks a dime. Sales for the most part have not been liberal, as growers anticipate further advances in the market due to speculative and competitive activity on the part of buyers. Due to the prevalence of neck rot and sour skins, most growers are finding it necessary to set the onions aside when topping and re-sort later, when the neck rot shows up.

Scattered Quiet Business Done in 64s, Finer Wools

BOSTON, Jan. 9 (AP) - (U. S. Dept. Agr.) A scattered quiet business was transacted in 64s and finer territory wools. Sales were mostly moderate in volume. Strictly combing graded 64s and finer territory wools were quoted at 84-85 cents scored basis with very little of this class moving. Demand ran more to shorter staple wools. Graded French combing 64s and finer territory wools moved occasionally at 81-83 cents scored basis while graded clothing staple brought 75-80 cents.

ENLARGED BUYING IS GRAIN PRICE LIFTER

CHICAGO, Jan. 9. (AP) - Enlarged buying apparently due a good deal to reports the new grain exchange code would be unobjectionable to traders gave prices a lift today. Unfavorable crop reports, with forecasts pointing to continued drought conditions over important parts of the United States winter wheat belt, were also a stimulus to returns of prices. One leading unofficial authority said that fully three times the usual amount of moisture southwest and west must be received between now and the heavy growing period, if severe trouble on top of damage already done was to be averted.
