Latham and Marcia Weaver Latham when they observe their wedding anniversary Saturday, January 13, at the home of their son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Latham of Silverton. The event has been attracting nationwide attention and already congratulations from various friends throughout the country have been arriving at the Latham home.

Mr. Latham was born in Ohio August 11, 1841. He attended Hiram college for a time and was under the instruction of James A. Garfield at the time the latter was president of the college. In 1861, he enlisted with the 41st Ohio volunteer infantry. For three years he served with this, and during that time was twice wounded. Later he reenlisted and served seven months with the 39th Ohio volunteers.

Married in War Days Mrs. Latham was born in Pennsylvania December 26, 1841. When a very small girl she moved with her parents to Ohio. It was while Mr. Latham was on a furlough recovering from his wounds that the two were married January 13, 1864, at Welchfield, O.

Mr. and Mrs. Latham moved to Nebraska in 1882, to Idaho in 1902 and to California in 1913. Since that time they have made several changes between that state and Oregon. For some years they made their home at Silverton. Six years ago they moved to Silverton where they are now making their permanent home.

Mr. and Mrs. Latham have three children, H. B. Latham of Silverton, Marc L. Latham of Oakland, Cal., and Mrs. J. D. Goble of Los Angeles. They also have five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
