### Future Farmers Form Co-op Buying and Selling Turkeys

AMITY, Jan. 12.—The Bank of Amity which closed its doors last spring, will resume business Monday morning, January 15, on a 100 per cent guaranteed deposit basis. The bank has been under the supervision of H. W. Torbert and he reports that the bank is stronger today than at any time during its history. The deposits of the Amity bank fall under the federal government bank insurance.

# TILLAMOOK BURN TO GET ATTENTION

Oregon will be represented at the national meeting of lumbermen to consider phases of the lumbermen's national recovery act code, it was announced Thursday. Lynn F. Cronemiller, state forester, left Friday for Washington, D. C., to attend the session January 22 to 28.

The particular part of the code to be considered provides that loggers must leave tracts of timber logged in a reproductive condition. The conference will outline a set-up to carry out this program. Cronemiller stated he believed consideration would also be given to the matter of the Tillamook timber burn, to provide mills in that district with its share of logs from other sections, as now being done in allotting all mills a certain stumpage, even to the extent of taking from one to sell another less fortunate in timber supply. Prior to this meeting Cronemiller will attend a hearing on the Clark-McNary bill which provides federal aid for state and privately owned lands in combating forest fires. Last year Oregon was awarded \$56,000 of the fund.
