POLK FARMERS TO BACK SALES LEVY

"(1) Whereas, the burden of taxation on farm lands has in recent years grown unbearable; and,

"(2) Whereas, farmers of Polk county have been unable to pay their taxes; and,

"(3) Whereas, tax delinquencies on farm lands in this county approximate 35 to 40 per cent; and,

"(4) Whereas, due to these delinquencies the public schools are in a desperate situation, such a relief of some form is not offered for the next session, many schools of the state and some in this county will have to close; and,

"(5) Whereas, at the recent special session of the legislature, after due and conscientious deliberation and careful consultation and examination, no method other than a temporary general sales tax could be found to alleviate the heavy burden on farm lands and at the same time afford relief to the schools,

"Therefore, Be It Resolved: That we the representative farmers and grangers of Polk county
