'DINNER AT EIGHT' NOW AT ELSINORE

Dressler and the Barrymores in Cast of Play Which Was Stage Success

Upsetting all traditions of either theatre or screen, the talking picture version of the George S. Kaufman-Edna Ferber stage success, "Dinner at Eight," which ran on Broadway for more than a year, comes to the Elsinore theatre starting today with the most breath-taking aggregation of stars ever gathered together in the history of motion pictures, surpassing even the celebrated cast of "Grand Hotel."

The inimitable Marie Dressler offers another of her memorable performances, this time as an old-time musical comedy star. The two Barrymores, as usual, give flawless portrayals, John as a broken-down movie actor no longer able to secure parts; Lionel as the host on the verge of breakdown from overwork. Wallace Beery as an unscrupulous financier, Jean Harlow as his social-climbing wife, Lee Tracy as a breezy Broadway play agent, Edmund Lowe as a society doctor more interested in his women patients than his wife, Billie Burke as the hostess and Madge Evans as her daughter.

Briefly the plot concerns a dinner which a Park avenue hostess gives for two members of the British nobility. The dinner itself, however, takes but small space in the proceedings. Instead, the action is placed on what happens as the various guests receive their invitations and the respective proceedings which intervene prior to their arrival at the dinner table.

'AS HUSBANDS GO' IS GRAND FEATURE

Warner Baxter Here Again; Wife's Problem Made Theme of Picture

Warner Baxter, topping his triumphs in "Penthouse" and "Paddy," comes to the screen of the Grand theatre today in Fox Film's latest release, "As Husbands Go." The play is adapted from Rachel Crothers' stage success, and is said to equal her charming "Let Us Be Gay" and "When Ladies Meet."
