CHICAGO, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Setbacks in grain values formed the rule today except during a brief transient period at the start.

Doubts regarding legislative monetary developments at Washington tended to pull the wheat market down, and more than counterbalanced the stimulus of higher prices for securities. Absence of aggressive demand for wheat rather than pronounced pressure to sell was apparent most of the time, but there was plenty of wheat for sale when the market rose momentarily to within one-quarter cent of the best figures of last Monday following that day's announcement of President Roosevelt's monetary plan.

Wheat closed unsettled, 1/4 cent below yesterday's finish, corn 1/4 cent down, oats 1/4 cent off, and provisions unchanged to 5 cents decline.
