"MASSACRE" OPENS WEEK AT ELSINORE

Richard Barthelmess Takes Indian Role; Colorful Scenes Promised

Richard Barthelmess' latest picture for First National, "Massacre," will be shown on the screen of the Elsinore theatre for the first time today.

Barthelmess has the role of the Indian youth whose magnificent physique and dare-devil riding sets the hearts of the gentler sex aflutter. Ann Dvorak plays the part of the Indian maid, while Claire Dodd is the flirtatious society siren.

There are colorful scenes which revive the ancient Indian tribal rites and ceremonial dances. These were filmed at the old Indian stamping ground at Chateworth, near Hollywood, and in the surrounding desert around the water holes where the Redmen once camped.

Three hundred real Indians, representing 15 tribes, appear in bit parts and extra roles, forming a picturesque background for the stirring events. Chief Standing Bear, of the Sioux tribe, acted as technical advisor in order to insure the accuracy of the Indian scenes.

The supporting cast includes Dudley Digges, Henry O'Neill, Robert Barrat, Arthur Kohl, Sidney Toler and Tully Marshall.

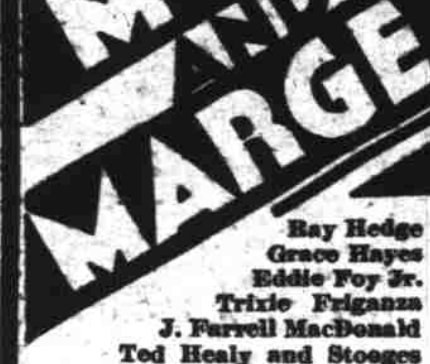

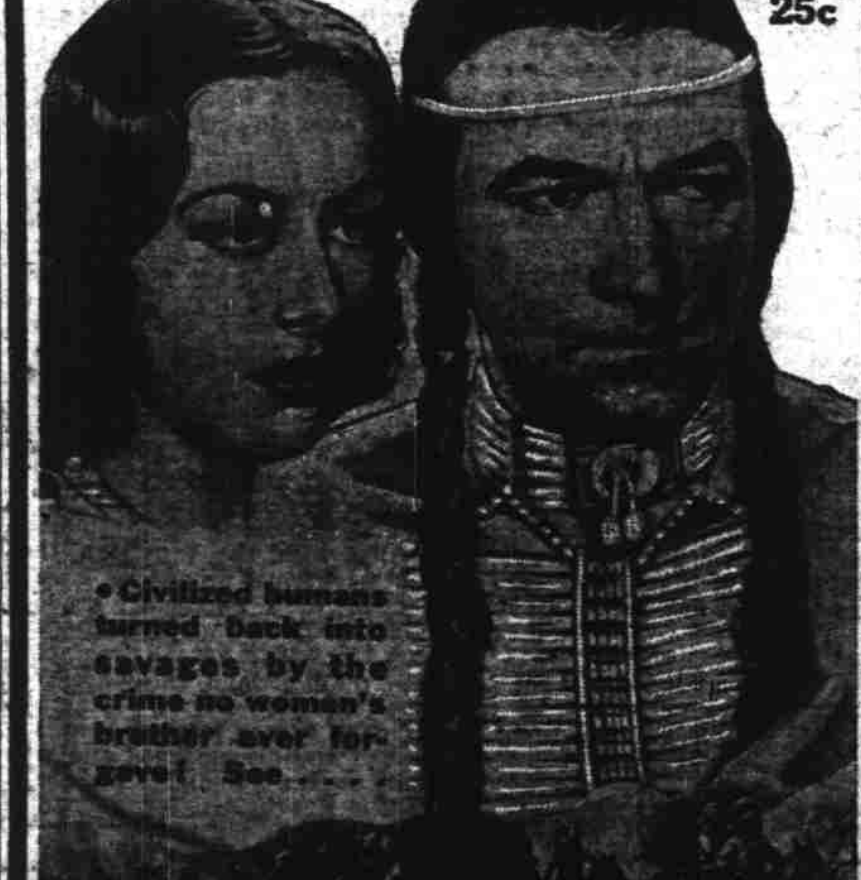
